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AVIATION CLEARANCE REQUIRED

Aviation Division's review of building plans must be obtained before issuing a building permit for a building or structure (new construction or alteration to existing building or structure that increases the height) which is

- 1) More than 200 feet in height above the ground level at its site (regardless of the distance from an airport or heliport).
- 2) Of greater height than an imaginary splayed plane extending outward and upward (axially or transverse to the runway) at a slope of (vertical to horizontal) (see attached illustration)
 - a. 1:100 for a horizontal distance of 20,000 feet from the nearest point of the nearest runway of each airport, that has at least one runway more than 3,200 feet in actual length.¹
 - b 1:50 for a horizontal distance of 10,000 feet from the nearest point of the nearest runway of each airport, whose longest runway is no more than 3,200 feet in actual length ²
 - c. 1:25 for a horizontal distance of 5,000 feet from the nearest point of the nearest landing and takeoff area of each heliport.³

These requirements apply to an airport or heliport that is available for public use or operated by any armed forces of the United States
