In re Vacation of Streets,
in East San Gabriel)

This being the time regularly set by order of this Board and publication of notice thereof, for hearing the petition of E. K. Alexander and 12 others for the vacation of certain streets in the Town of East San Gabriel, the same is taken up, and E. K. Alexander, I. N. Van Nuys, H. W. Cowles and J. D. Bicknell were examined in regard to the statements in the petition. Geo. J. Denis on behalf of Daniel Kavane protested against the closing of Elm Avenue between Fifth and Sixth Streets, no other protests having been filed, and upon motion of Supervisor Longdon, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that said petition be and the same is hereby granted, except that portion relating to Elm Avenue between Fifth and Sixth Streets.

And it is further ordered that following named streets, as shown on a map of the Town of East San Gabriel as recorded in Book 21 at Page 79 et seq., of the Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, California, to wit:-

All that portion of Broadway in East San Gabriel lying East of San Gabriel Boulevard and North of the New Dalton Road, as surveyed in August 1895, by E. T. Wright, County Surveyor and accepted by the Board of Supervisors in lieu of the 80 foot street called Broadway on the recorded map of said East San Gabriel. Said strip to be abandoned, estimated to be 20 feet wide: First Street from Maple Avenue to Broadway; Second Street from Maple Avenue to Broadway; Third Street from Maple Avenue to Broadway; Fourth Street from Maple Avenue to Live Oak Avenue; Sixth Street from Maple Avenue to Elm Avenue; Sixth Street from Live Oak Avenue to Broadway; Second Street from Broadway to Santa Fe Avenue; Second Street from Commercial Avenue to Grand Avenue; Third Street from Broadway to Grand Avenue; East Street from Broadway north to Maple Avenue; A Street from Broadway north to Town Limits; B Street from Broadway north to Town Limits; Fourth Street from Broadway to Myrtle Avenue; Fourth Street from Commercial Avenue to Grand Avenue; Fifth Street from Santa Fe Avenue to Commercial Avenue; Sixth Street from Broadway to Myrtle; Fifth Street from Spring Street to Grand Avenue; Elm Avenue from Fifth Street to Eastern Boundary of Town; Olive Avenue from Fifth Street to Eastern Boundary of Town; Live Oak Avenue from Fifth Street to Eastern Boundary of Town; Angelene Avenue from Fourth Street to West side of First Street; Santa Fe Avenue from Fourth Street to West side of First Street; Commercial Avenue from Fifth Street to West side of First Street; Spring Street from Fifth Street to Fourth Street; Seventh Street from Live Oak Avenue to Olive Street;

be and the same are hereby vacated and abandoned, and the land there in contained restored to acreage, conditioned upon the filing for record in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County, California, of a certified copy of this order attached to a map showing all property as affected by the same, by the petitioners.
