In re Vacation of Streets and Alleys)
Lots and Blocks in Florencia Heights)
Tract, Wilmington Road District)

Whereas, Benton McCoy and twenty-one others freeholders and residents of the Wilmington Road District, have petitioned this Board to vacate and abandon certain streets and alleys in the Florencia Heights Tract, as per map of said tract filed in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County on April 25th 1899; and

Whereas, a portion of said tract, having been annexed to the City of San Pedro by vote of the qualified electors of said City, on the 31st day of July, 1899; Therefore be it.

Resolved, that the prayer of the petitioners be, and the same is hereby granted, except that portion that lies in and forms a part of the City of San Pedro, and it is further ordered that all of Seventh Street, Eighth Street, Ninth Street, Tenth Street, Twelfth Street, Thirteenth Street, Fourteenth Street, Fifteenth Street and Sixteenth Street, lying west of Coffey Street or the west boundary of the City of San Pedro, and all of Sepulveda Avenue, and all the alleys in Blocks 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 27 and all of the alley in Block 24 excepting 180 feet thereof, extending eastward from the northwest corner of Lot 17 of said Block 24, be and the same are hereby vacated and abandoned, and the land therein contained restored to acreage.
