A. Addendum

Forms PW-4.3.1 (Task 2 Service Fees for South Whittier), PW-4.3.2 (Task 2 Service Fees for Avocado Heights) and PW-4.3.3 (Task 2 Service Fees for Santa Monica Mountains) of the RFP are deleted in their entirety and replaced with revised forms entitled Form PW-4.3.1 Revised (Task 2 Service Fees for South Whittier), PW-4.3.2 Revised (Task 2 Service Fees for Avocado Heights), and PW-4.3.3 Revised (Task 2 Service Fees for Santa Monica Mountains). B. Informational Update

Please take note of the following revisions to Addendum 3 for questions and answers to #29 and #59. (Please note that the changes that have been added are in **boldface** and deleted languages are ~~strikethrough~~.)

29. **Question:** Annual Curbside Cleanup Event for bulky items, "excess refuse", and "excess green waste" should signify limited amounts for disposal and NOT unlimited amounts. Composition-Construction materials, as classified under C & D collection, should be prohibited from bulky item collection. This is in part a Safety Issue, broken glass, hazardous waste, etc. often is set out for collection. The amounts of materials for these collection services has become a concern due to the increased amounts of waste being discarded, and residents bringing in waste from outside areas for collection day.

Response: The sweep bulky item collection method has been replaced in the South Whittier service area with the ~~2~~ **3** on-call bulky item collections just like for the other two areas. Please note that the bulky item collection service in the previous contracts for these areas require the franchise hauler to provide 2 on-call collections of unlimited amounts as well as an annual curbside clean up event in unlimited amounts. The new contracts have limited the amounts to 10 per on-call and 20 for the annual clean up event. C & D collections have been changed from unlimited amounts in the existing contract to two 70 pound bags, containers, or bundles as set forth in Section 20.72.090 C of the Los Angeles County Code of Ordinances.

59. **Question:** Exhibit 3A3 B: Page 39 Bulky Item and Excess Solid Waste Collection. Paragraph B1 Weekly Service:
- Would the county consider removing the requirement to sweep the route on their collection days?

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Response: Yes, the sweep bulky item collection method has been replaced with the 2 3 on-call bulky item collections just like for the other two areas.
