REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS – INFORMATIONAL UPDATE 2 OPERATING FOOD AND VENDING MACHINE SERVICES (2011-PA007)

Thank you for attending our mandatory Proposers' Conference for Operating Food and Vending Machine Services (2011-PA007) held on Tuesday, May 10, 2011.

The deadline to submit proposals has been extended to **Monday**, **June 6**, **2011**, **by 5:30 p.m.**

Please note that the questions represent the questions asked by Proposers in the exact form and context as submitted. No changes were made by the County to any questions.

QUESTIONS

1. <u>Question:</u> I also like to know the number of employees, the size of the existing Cafeteria and other pertinent information about the existing cafeteria operation?

Response: The current Contractor has five employees working at the Cafeteria. The food service facility includes a 500 square-foot kitchen area, a 6,483 square-foot general dining area (Dining Center), and a 2,450 square-foot private dining area (Alhambra Room) as described in the RFP, Part II, Exhibit A, Scope of Work, paragraph B.1. Cafeteria Services.

Question: Who is the current Contractor?

Response: The current Contractor is LunchStop, Inc.

3. **Question:** The facility is only open Mon - Thursday?

Response: Yes.

4. **Question:** Is the County going to subsidize the food service program?

Response: No.

5. **Question:** Does the quoted revenue number of \$200,000.00 include both food service and vending revenues? If so what is the break down for each portion of the operation?

Response: Yes, the quoted revenue of \$200,000 includes both food service and vending revenues. Based on the sales information for the past twelve months, 95 percent of the revenue is from the food service and 5 percent of the revenue is from the vending machines. For actual sales information, please see Enclosure A and D.

6. Question: Since one of the bidders will be the current operator lunch stop. Lunch stop is aware of the current sales level. Lunch stop has the knowledge of the sales volume, therefore they are able to project a much accurate compensation proposal to the DWP. For evaluation purposes, the other bidders are at disadvantage of knowledge of the current sales, Can you give a more accurate sales information so all the bidders are at a level playing field?

Response: Please see Enclosure A that contains the sales information for the past 12 months.

7. **Question:** Can you provide catering sales info?

Response: Enclosure A contains the catering sales information.

8. **Question:** Can you please provide the existing store menu, catering menu and prices?

Response: Please see Enclosure B for the catering menu and Enclosure C for the existing menu and prices.

9. **Question:** What are the current opening hours of the cafeteria?

10. **Question:** Would you consider visiting one or more of our locations for an actual comparison food tasting, Food quality and quantity evaluation by a DPW panel?

Response: As stated in the RFP, Part I, Section 4.E.7, Optional Interview/Clarification/On-Site Visit, the County may, at its option, invite one or more Proposers to make a written or verbal clarification or presentation, and/or participate in an interview, or County may conduct an onsite visit to Proposer's operated facility, before a final selection is made.

11. **Question:** What is the employee count at this facility?

Response: There are approximately between 1,350 and 1,400 employees in the main headquarters building and annex building combined.

12. **Question:** What is the average visitor count at the facility?

<u>Response:</u> The daily average visitor count at the facility for both the main building and annex building is 192 visitors. Please note that this does not include those visitors who are County employees from other departments wearing appropriate identification.

13. **Question:** Is it possible to extend the deadline to submit our bid?

Response: The deadline to submit the proposals has been extended as listed on the first page of this addendum.

14. **Question:** Would the Cafeteria RFP evaluation committee consider to meet with the General and daily operations Supervisors and Department heads of the candidates who will be submitting proposals for the DPW Cafeteria operations?

Response: Please refer to the response for question No. 10 above.

15. **Question:** Could you please give me the sales and commissions figures for the vending machine contract?

Response: Please see Enclosure D for the sales and commissions figures for vending machine sales for the past 12 months.

16. **Question:** Also, during the walk through, I noticed that the current vending machine company was First Class Vending. Can you tell me if they are disqualified from consideration, since they did not attend the conference or the walk through?

Response: As stated in the RFP, Part I, Section 1.A, Proposer's Conference, Proposals received from Proposers not signed in as attending this Conference and walk-through will be rejected as nonresponsive. Please note that a subcontractor is not required to have attended the conference and walk-through. A proposer can use a subcontractor that was not present at the conference and walk-through.
