Revisions:

Page 2 of Form PW-2, Schedule of Prices, has been revised. Please use the revised Page 2, (Enclosure A) in your proposal. Item **1.A.(4)** has been revised from 6 estimated visits per year to 52 per year. It is to your benefit to fully review and understand the revision that has been made to this form.

Clarifications:

Question: How often will the County conduct audits of the successful Proposer's records as well as field visits with the Proposer's employees to ascertain compliance with the Living Wage Program?

Response: The County will conduct annual audits of the records and at least one annual field visit to interview employees and ascertain compliance with the Living Wage Program.
