First it is important that we state that United Pumping Service, Inc. has several emergency response units equipped and ready to go at all times. These units are both located at our City of Industry Terminal and driven in the field by emergency response supervisors. This enables our personnel to literally walk up to the response unit with their gear bag and drive off to the spill location. At the end of each workday and on weekends and holidays, all emergency response supervisors take response units home to ensure rapid response.

Each emergency response unit is equipped with an assortment of drums (steel, poly, 30 gal, 55 gal, over packs, etc.) labels, manifests, L.D.R.'s, a pallet of absorbent, hand tools (brooms, shovels, etc.) hazcat kit, P.P.E., booms, pads, lighting, confined space equipment and sampling equipment and supplies.

Based upon our experience as the current subcontractor performing this work for the City of Los Angeles the equipment and materials listed meet the requirements of approximately 95% of the City of Los Angeles's spills. When additional items (pressure washers, bobcat loaders, etc.) are needed, the crew is able to quickly add the items to their truck and get under way.

Although our emergency response units are generally equipped with much more equipment and materials than required, the customer is only charged for items used.

United Pumping Service, Inc is capable of picking up all kinds of spills, including both liquids and solids, and we are able to mobilize this equipment and arrive at the scene within two hours. United Pumping Service, Inc is available 24 hours per day, 365 days per year, for emergency response. We also have employees that are accessible by pager and will return calls promptly (within 15 minutes). United Pumping Services, Inc also has traffic control equipment for every type of emergency situation.



## Work Plan

# **Environmental Investigations and Remediation's**

United Pumping will respond to County personnel upon knowledge of Environmental investigation and remediation project.

Upon receiving analytical reports and locations, United Pumping Service can then determine if waste is RCRA, NON-RCRA, or a Non hazardous waste and profiles will have to be made. United Pumping Service can then decide to drum material, pump out drums on site, place into roll-off bins or storage tanks for proper disposal and transportation according to best cost saving method for County of Los Angeles. If hazcatting procedure is needed, United Pumping will send project supervisor with proper personnel and equipment to perform all proper tests to determine what type of waste and proper procedures to properly take care of material.

United will provide proper equipment to load drums, pump liquid out of drums, transport roll-off bins, pump out liquid waste from storage tank and transport to proper disposal facility. United Supervisor will maintain in constant contact with County Supervisor to advise best method of providing service.

United Supervisor will advise all personnel with proper safety procedures and personal protective equipment according to profile of waste and follow all safety procedures when transporting waste. All vacuum drivers and roll- off driver will be advised of all safety procedures prior to leaving for site. All equipment operators will safety inspect all vehicles prior to leaving from United Pumping yard.

Once waste is properly loaded into vacuum truck, drums, roll off bins, supervisor will handle all manifests and have County Supervisor sign all appropriate paperwork and approve completion of project.

# 90-Day Hazardous Waste Pick-up

United Pumping will maintain contact with County Representative regarding 90-Day Hazardous and Non-Hazardous Waste pick-up at the various County Facilities.

Upon receiving inventory, United Pumping Service supervisor will meet with a County representative to schedule pick-up of waste according to amount of waste listed at each location. Supervisor will look at sites that might have unusual waste or containers to determine if any special packaging or extra over pack drums are needed. If any special packaging is needed, Supervisor will note to make sure these supplies and equipment are brought with crew for scheduled pick up. A schedule of times and pick up locations will be discussed and called or faxed into the County Representative. Once schedule is approved by the County Representative, United Pumping will prepare all manifests and labels and paperwork necessary for pick-up schedule.

Upon knowledge of amount of waste to be picked up at each location per day, United Pumping Supervisor will determine amount of equipment, supplies, size of transportation vehicle that will be needed as appropriate to size and amount of waste. (i.e.: large Stakebed, closed container truck).

United Pumping Service will send amount of employees necessary to complete size of job. All United Pumping Service employees have been 40 hours Haz-Woper trained and have experience with handling drummed and bulk waste streams. Supervisor and technicians will wear appropriate Personal Protection equipment necessary for type of waste they will be handling. Personal Protection Equipment includes hard hats, steel toe boots, appropriate type of gloves for waste streams they will be picking up, safety glasses, full-face protection if necessary. Safety meeting will be held to assure compliance with all regulations for each specific location.

All waste will be inspected, segregated, lab packed for transportation and disposal. All unknowns to be sampled and or field screened if necessary. All waste will be properly labeled, inventoried and included on appropriate pre-printed manifest. Once all drums or waste have been loaded on vehicle, Supervisor will check with County of Los Angeles Supervisor to obtain all proper signatures needed on manifests.

### Clarifiers

Vacuum truck will be inspected prior to leaving United Pumping Service site. All appropriate paperwork including job work sheet, site contact, and manifest will be reviewed by Supervisor prior to vacuum truck leaving site. Depending on location of clarifier and amount of hose necessary to pump material, appropriate amount of personnel will be sent. ### Storm Drain Decontamination (if needed)

United Pumping has years of experience with cleaning out storm drains, culverts and catch basins. We currently clean out all storms drains for Cal Trans- Los Angeles Area. All United Pumping Service personnel are trained in confined space procedures and follow the guidelines set forth by the State of California Occupational Safety and Health Agency (Ca1OSHA) and Public Works safety requirements. All traffic control will be determined and assessed as needed per scope of work.

United will contact the County Supervisor and meet at work site to access what type of equipment and personnel are needed to perform work. All equipment will be discussed with County Supervisor to determine exactly what is the most cost effective way to remove material and clean out storm drain. United has several equipment options available to County of Los Angeles including vactor jetters, vactor guzzlers, vactrons, dewatering bins, roll off bins, temporary tanks, confined space equipment and appropriate traffic control equipment for any size storm drain job. United is able to handle any type of waste that needs to be pumped out of the storm drains, liquid or solid.

Once work option is chosen, all equipment and personnel will be dispatched to site. Supervisor will have tailgate safety meeting prior to any work proceeding. All proper confined space will be set up-including tripods, air monitor, blowers, and personnel protection equipment specific to job. Health and Safety plan will be prepared prior to arrival at site and will be discussed at the tailgate meeting. Radio, phone and signals will be determined before any entry into storm drain. Once air monitor has registered safe entry for personnel- then work will begin. No work will be started unless it has been determined that it is safe for personnel to enter confined space. Appropriate amount of personnel will be on site to assure safety of any personnel in confined space. There will always be a United Pumping Supervisor on site monitoring air and will be logged every 15 minutes. If self supplied air is needed, United will be all appropriate equipment necessary for safety of employees. A confined space permit will be completed and posted at site. All personnel will wear appropriate personal protection equipment including hard hats, steel toe boots, tyvek (appropriate level), safety glasses, full-face respirator, and body harness. There will be extra man suited up at appropriate safety level to be ready in case of emergency. Personnel will be rotated at regular time intervals. Supervisor will continue to monitor air at all times for safety of employees.

Once all material has been removed and cleaned from Storm drain to the satisfaction of County Supervisor- material will be profiled according to vessel that is was loaded into. Depending on vessel (i.e.: Roll-off bins, dewatering bins, vacuum truck (liquid), storage tank (liquid) waste will be profiled, manifested and transported to proper approved disposal facility.

### **Emergency Response Procedures**

The following questions will be asked when County of Los Angeles-Department of Public Works & Transfer calls in for Emergency Spill Response

Call: (626) 961-9326 24 hours per day/ 7 days a week

### Have ready:

- Caller name, phone number and Department
- Incident location (including cross street)
- Description of material (if known)

Liquid, solid, powder

Color

Odor?

### Description of container

- a) Steel, poly, fiber, other steel (in this scenario)
- b) Condition
- c) Markings

### Description of spill site

- a) Quantity spilled- how large is the spill?
- b) What spilled?
- c) Surface- Material on concrete, asphalt or soil, is it in confined space?
- d) Whether material is contained or "running off"
- e) Size of area affected
- f) Whether any drains are affected- did material enter any waterways?

This may seem like a lot of questions but it is accomplished very quickly (1-2 minutes) and helps us to appraise the incident's needs more accurately and respond more <u>efficiently</u>.

### EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROCEDURES "FIRST RESPONDER"

### I. Secure Area and Deny Access

- A. Close off access roads and/or adjacent traffic lanes and surface streets. Reopen them when determinations of health and safety factors are properly assessed.
- B. Evacuate immediate area. <u>DO NOT</u> attempt to rescue anyone directly exposed unless it can be done without endangering additional lives, including your own.
- C. Deny access to the secured area to all unauthorized people. This includes on lookers, motorists, and/or the news media.
- D. Establish an area upwind to serve as a staging area for the clean-up personnel and equipment. This area can also serve as a command post for the responding regulatory agencies.

### II. Identification

- A. Keeping upwind, attempt to identify the material using available resources. At no time should you ever approach an unknown spill unless wearing full protective equipment. Possible resources for the identity of the unknown include:
  - 1. The driver of the vehicle and any type of shipping papers, which would describe the material.
  - 2. Placards and/or Identification numbers.
  - 3. Transporter's name and vehicle license number.
  - 4. Any markings visible on the container:
    - a. Chemical or trade names.
    - b. Manufacturer.
    - c. Hazard class or warning labels.

### III. Relay Information

- A. Relay any information pertinent to the spill to the dispatcher when you call for a response team.
  - 1. Location of the spill.
  - 2. Size of the spill area.
  - 3. Identity of the spilled material, if known. If unknown, any information that relates to the unknown material should be relayed so that a possible identification might be determined.
  - 4. The location of any waterway that may be affected.
  - 5. Wind direction and speed (if known). This will aid in the determination of further evacuations.
- B. Contact CHEMTREC 1-800/424-9300 for assistance in identifying the spill material.
- C. Contact other necessary agencies:
  - 1. Local Fire Department ----- 911
  - 2. Department of Health Services N. of 91 Fwy. (818) 567-3000 S. of 91 Fwy. (310)590-4936
  - 3. U. S. Coast Guard ----(310) 499-5555
  - 4. National Response Center ----- (800) 424-8802
  - 5. Etc.

ALL CHEMICAL SPILLS SHOULD BE CONSIDERED EXTREMELY HAZARDOUS UNTIL DETERMINED OTHERWISE. EXTREME CAUTION SHOULD BE EXERCISED WHEN APPROACHING A CHEMICAL SPILL, INCLUDING THE USE OF APPROPRIATE SAFETY EQUIPMENT. IF THE APPROPRIATE SAFETY EQUIPMENT IS UNKNOWN, WEAR FULL RESPONSE GEAR: INCLUDING SELF-CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS.

### I. LAND SPILLS

### A. Containment

- 1. Access population proximity to containment area.
- 2. Secure containment area.
- 3. Some type of containment methods include:
  - a. Dikes, dams, ditches
  - b. Natural Topography
  - c. Excavated sumps, ponds, and trenches.
  - d. Temporary patching or repair of leak.

### **B.** Isolation

- 1. Prevent incompatible materials from mixing.
- 2. Segregate incompatible chemicals.

### C. Recovery and Removal

- 1. Once product is contained and isolated, then removal of the product is possible.
- 2. The product may be recovered or removed for disposal.

### II. WATER SPILLS

### A. Containment

- 1. Most difficult when large or moving bodies of water are receptors of the chemical.
- 2. Containment must be as near the source as possible.

- 3. DO NOT divert liquids to sanitary sewer lines.
- 4. DO NOT trap volatile chemicals enclosed conduits, such as storm drains.
- 5. Some type of containment methods include:
  - a. Overflow/underflow dam
  - b. Dirt plugs/ traps
  - c. Booms, sorbents

### B. Recovery and Removal

- 1. Floating substance
  - a. Use skimmers, sorbants, scuppers (shoreline pits).
  - b. Recovery success depends on effectiveness of containment method.
  - c. use prevailing wind direction to assist floating material entering boomed area.

### 2. Solubles and Emulsions

- a. difficult recovery but not impossible.
- b. Activated carbon or precitation.
