BOIL WATER NOTICE

Boil Your Water Before Drinking or Food Preparation to Avoid Illness

The Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29 and the State Water Resources Control Board are advising customers to use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution to avoid stomach or intestinal illness.

The affected area includes customers within the following areas:

- Busch Drive and Cuthbert Road
- Philips Avenue and Sea View Drive

Please see the attached map for additional details on the affected area.

We will inform you when tests show that water is safe to drink and no longer need to boil your water. We are working to resolve this issue as quickly as possible.

On 04/03/2026, we discovered a tank (Lower Busch Tank) was not secured and out of an abundance of caution, we are testing the water. Although we have no confirmation of contamination, the integrity of the water system may have been compromised. Do not drink the water without boiling it first



- Boil all water for one (1) minute (rolling boil).
- Let water cool before drinking.
- Use boiled or bottled water for drinking, brushing teeth, and food preparation until further notice.
- Boiling water kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

If you are unable to boil your water:

Household unscented liquid bleach



- For clear water, use 8 drops (1/8 tspn.) of bleach for 1 gallon of water. For cloudy water, filter through a clean cloth and use 16 drops (1/4 tspn.) of bleach for 1 gallon of water.
- Mix well. Allow to stand for 30 minutes before using.
- Water may taste or smell like chlorine. This means disinfection has occurred.

Please do not exceed recommended amount.
