## **AGREEMENT TO THE REQUIREMENTS FOR INSTALLATION OF ON-STREET ACCESSIBLE PARKING ZONE**

Applicants (and Caregivers, if applicable) for On-Street Accessible Parking Zones must agree to and abide by the following requirements:

1. The Applicant (or Caregiver) understands that completing the application is not a guarantee that it will be approved.
2. The Applicant (or Caregiver) must observe and obey all parking regulations and laws to comply with the California Vehicle Code and the Los Angeles County Code.
3. The On-Street Accessible Parking Zone shall not be used for long-term storage of vehicles. Any vehicle using the zone must be kept in good repair and shall be operational, as outlined in the California Vehicle Code. For the purposes of this agreement, long-term storage of vehicles is defined as any vehicle parked or left standing on a public street in the same location and not driven or moved in excess of 72 hours.
4. Public Works reserves the right to removal or relocate an existing On-Street Accessible Parking Zone at any time, based on an engineering and accessibility study or an assessment of existing conditions.
5. The Applicant (or Caregiver) understands that an On-Street Accessible Parking Zone is located entirely within the public right of way and remains public property at all times. Installation of an On-Street Accessible Parking Zone does not create any ownership interest, easement, preferential property right, reserved parking privilege, or exclusive entitlement for the Applicant, Caregiver, adjacent property owner, resident, or any other private party. The parking space is available on a first-come, first-served basis for any vehicle lawfully displaying a valid disabled person placard or license plate.
6. The authority to enforce parking laws is the responsibility of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the California Highway Patrol.
