I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:05 p.m.

Mike Mohajer introduced Doug Kramer as a new Task Force member, representing the Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The January 30, 1997 minutes were approved as presented.

III. CONSIDERATION OF CONCURRENCE WITH THE FINAL DRAFT LOS ANGELES COUNTY COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT

Mr. Mohajer stated that staff has prepared the final draft, and copies were distributed last week for the Task Force's review. Mr. Mohajer indicated that several additional revisions have been made to the document since its submittal to the Task Force last week.

Mr. Mohajer reported that Chapter 1, Section 1.22 has been expanded to include background information on the document itself, such as the development of the document, the approval process, public information meeting information, etc. Betsey Landis suggested a revision to Chapter 1, page 1-19, paragraph 2, regarding the description of the responsibilities of the Task Force.

Mr. Mohajer also reported that comments from the last Task Force meeting have been incorporated into Chapter 2.

Discussion ensued regarding further clarification of the shortfall scenarios for in-County disposal capacity on page xx-ii. After much discussion, a motion was introduced to accept the portions of the document up to and including Chapters 1-3 as presented. Motion carried, 10-2.

Mr. Mohajer stated that for Chapter 4, disposal capacity shortfall scenarios have been expanded. After some discussion, a motion was introduced and approved to accept Chapter 4, including the supplemental handout, as presented. Motion carried, 11-1.

Mr. Mohajer reported that no additional revisions have been made to Chapter 5. A motion was introduced and approved to accept the chapter as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Mohajer reported that no additional revisions have been made to Chapter 6. A motion was introduced and approved to accept the chapter as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motions were then introduced and approved to accept Chapters 7-10 as presented. Motions carried unanimously.

Mr. Mohajer stated that the final draft of the Siting Element will consist of three volumes: Volume I, as reviewed by the Task Force; Volume 2, which discusses public comments and responses, as well as a summary of comments received at the public information meetings and responses; and Volume 3, which consists of written communication staff has had with various outside agencies regarding the document.

IV. CONSIDERATION OF CONCURRENCE WITH THE FINAL DRAFT LOS ANGELES COUNTY COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY PLAN

Mr. Mohajer stated that the very last page of the handout (Section 1.31) was expanded to discuss the process for preparing the document, similar to the criteria as identified for the Siting Element. A motion was introduced and approved to accept the portions of the document up to and including Chapter 1 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Dave Smith stated that Chapter 2 has been revised to include the comments from the last Task Force meeting. After some discussion regarding Table 2-2, it was determined that Goal #6 will be revised as discussed (Executive Summary as well). A motion was then introduced and approved to accept Chapter 2. Motion carried unanimously.

After a very brief discussion, it was determined that a period should be added at the end of page 3-2. A motion was then introduced and approved to accept Chapter 3. Motion carried unanimously.

Motions were then introduced and approved to accept Chapters 4-6 as presented. Motions carried unanimously.

Mr. Smith stated that the final draft of the Summary Plan will consist of five volumes: Volumes I and II, as reviewed by the Task Force; Volume 3, which discusses public comments and responses; Volume 4, which consists of the Negative Declaration; and Volume 5, which consists of environmental information with responses to comments.

V. OPEN DISCUSSION/PUBLIC COMMENT

Ginger Bremberg asked whether further participation by the members of the Task Force is necessary in attending city council and/or Board of Supervisors' meetings regarding the aforementioned documents. Mr. Mohajer stated that these documents were prepared under the auspices of the Task Force and staff would certainly welcome participation by the members if any cities would request further information and/or a presentation regarding the documents.

Mr. Mohajer also stated that once the documents are presented to the Board of Supervisors, staff will request that the Board authorize the Department to release the documents to all cities within the County for the 90-day approval process. Mr. Mohajer reported that the Board cannot take any action on these documents until such time as the documents are approved, individually, by the majority of the cities containing the majority of the incorporated population.

VI. NEXT MEETING DATE

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for March 20, 1997, 1:00 p.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:01 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Under Item IV, second paragraph, Betsey Landis requested that "feet" be inserted in describing maximum elevation above mean sea level. The November 21, 1996 minutes were then approved as amended.

III. PRESENTATION ON THE CITY OF SANTA CLARITA'S REPORT, "APPROACHING AN INTEGRATED SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR LOS ANGELES COUNTY, CALIFORNIA" BY LYNN HARRIS, CITY OF SANTA CLARITA

Lynn Harris, Deputy City Manager, introduced Paul Brotzman and Frank Bernheisel, who addressed the Task Force regarding the above-mentioned report, followed by a question and answer period. Audio is available upon request.

IV. COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT

A. Review of Major Comments Received on the Preliminary Draft

Mike Mohajer referred to the packet that was previously mailed to the members/alternates (Attachment A) and discussion ensued regarding comments received on the draft document and staff's responses. Mr. Mohajer indicated that all written and oral comments received will be included in the Final Draft.

B. Consideration of Chapter 2, "Goals and Policies" of the Final Draft

Kerry Morford, City of Glendale, addressed the members of the Task Force, and suggested a revision to page 2-3, third bullet, item 3, to read, "the full development (owner-authorized utilization) of available or potentially available capacity at Scholl Canyon Landfill."

Ora Lampman, City of Burbank, addressed the members of the Task Force, and agreed with the abovementioned revision. Mr. Lampman also advised the Task Force of the City's recycling program and land disposal facility.

Discussion ensued regarding the word "expedite" in reference to the permitting and development of Elsmere Canyon. A motion was introduced and aproved that the word "expedite" will be used consistently throughout the policy document calling for either in-County landfill disposal capacity, out-of-County remote disposal facilities, or transformation technologies. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was introduced and approved to refine the language regarding land use decisions and wasteshed boundaries. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynn Harris stated that Towsley Canyon is surrounded by public land, and that there are studies on record indicating that the proposed site is not an environmentally sound proposal. Steve Maguin stated that the Committee is not aware of these reports. Ms. Harris requested that the Task Force postpone action on including Towsley Canyon in the final draft document until such time as the City of Santa Clarita can make copies of these reports available to the Task Force. No motion was introduced.

A motion was introduced and approved to replace the word "maximize" on page 2-4, third bullet, with "facilitate". Motion carried, 12 to 1.

A motion was introduced and approved to replace the word "promote" on page 2-4, Policies to Maximize Utilization of Out-of-County/Remote Disposal Facilities, with "coordinate". Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was introduced and approved to replace the word "credit" on page 2-5, second bullet, with "economic incentive". Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was introduced and approved to insert the words "where appropriate" after "will require" in all bullets. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept Chapter 2, as presented and with subsequent revisions as discussed. Motion carried unanimously.

C. Review of Various Tables Incorporating New Waste Quantities

Mr. Mohajer stated that for Table 4-2, the preliminary draft indicated waste disposal quantities for the last quarter of 1994 and the first three quarters of 1995. This version of the table now incorporates disposal quantities for the last quarter of 1995. A motion was introduced and approved to accept the document as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Mohajer reported that Table 4-3 has been updated to include waste quantities for 1995. A motion was introduced and approved to accept the document as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Mohajer referred to the Table of Contents, Chapter 5, and indicated that the document identifies alternative technologies discussed in the chapter.

Mr. Mohajer stated that Table 8-1, as requested by the Task Force, discusses out-of-County landfills. Betsey Landis requested that the spelling of the word "existing" be revised. A motion was then introduced and approved to accept the document. Motion carried unanimously.

V. COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY PLAN

A. Review of Major Comments Received on the Preliminary Draft

David Smith referred to the packet that was previously mailed to the members/alternates (Attachment A) and discussion ensued regarding comments received on the draft document and staff's responses.

B. Consideration of Chapters 1 and 2

After a brief discussion, a motion was introduced and approved to accept Chapter 1, with revisions as discussed. Motion carried unanimously.

After a brief discussion, it was determined that staff will reverify the information in Table 2-1, and a statement regarding data submission will be included in the table. A motion was then introduced and approved to accept the document. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept Chapter 2, with revisions as discussed. Motion carried unanimously.

VI. OPEN DISCUSSION/PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Mohajer reported that Mike Miller, City of Los Angeles Bureau of Sanitation, and alternate to Del Biagi on this Task Force, is retiring from the City. His luncheon will be held on February 20, 1997. Therefore, Mr. Mohajer requested that the next Task Force meeting of February 20, 1997, commence at 1:30 p.m. A motion was so introduced and approved. Motion carried unanimously.

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Los Angeles County Countywide Siting Element and Countywide Integrated Waste Management Summary Plan

The preliminary drafts of the Countywide Siting Element and the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Summary Plan are currently being revised to address all appropriate comments received on the documents. The final drafts of the documents will include responses to all written and oral comments received during the public review period of March 11 through October 17, 1996.

The following is a brief summary of the comments received.

Siting Element

- The Siting Element is inconsistent with AB 939's waste management hierarchy, where landfilling is the least preferred option, and that diversion must be pursued first regardless of cost considerations.
- Expand/strengthen the goals and policies, as they relate to maximizing the use of out-of-County disposal facilities, and promoting the development alternative disposal technologies.
- The County's waste generation and disposal capacity need projections are overestimated.
- Consider additional time-to-crisis scenarios, including scenarios that consider exports to out-of-County facilities, diversion rates exceeding 50 percent, and capacity saving measures at in-County Class III landfills.
- Expand discussion on alternative technologies.
- Eliminate all proposed in-County new landfill sites and proposed expansion of existing sites. The County should assume that new landfills in the County are unlikely and plan accordingly.
- Expand discussion of out-of-County disposal facilities and rail haul.
- All references to the County Solid Waste Management Action Plan should be removed.

Summary Plan

- The goals, policies, and objectives in Chapter 2 should be quantifiable and measurable in order to provide a mechanism for measuring progress.
- Describe the difference between the Siting Element and the Summary Plan.

The Countywide Siting Element, Madam Mike Mohajer: Chair, as you know it, the document was prepared, reviewed, and commented on by the Plan Subcommittee, as instructed by this Task Force. The Plan Review Subcommittee reviewed the whole document, chapter by chapter, as prepared by staff beginning last year. Therefore, the document before you is what was reviewed by the Subcommittee before it went out on the street. Because State law requires the Task Force to review the document and submit comments, we have gone one step We prepared the document up front with the further. input from the Task Force. However, we're making sure that we bring it before this body, again, to see if there are additional comments that this body wants to provide that goes in the public documents before we prepare the final.

Ginger Bremberg: Is there anyone? Al, you're the Chair of the Plan Review Subcommittee. Is there anything you would like to add to what Mike said?

At this point, considerable discussion was held regarding various issues with each of the documents. The following is a paraphrasing of the final revisions requested and comments. Detailed audio is available for review upon request.

Siting Element

- Revise text to read, "the documents were prepared by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works in coordination with the Task Force."
- Suggest that the County/cities work toward promoting State legislation or introduce legislation which would promote development of waste-to-energy by giving more credits to kilowatt hours.
- ♦ Goal 2.4.4., page 2-5, under policies, strengthen the language for more active participation by the County.
- ♦ Include a chart similar to Table ES-4 for out-of-County landfills in Chapter 8.
- ♦ Include a footnote and/or parenthetical expression concerning the date certain of closure of Lopez Canyon in Table ES-4.
- Expand scenarios in Chapter 4 to consider out-of-County disposal sites and waste-by-rail.

Summary Plan

- Revise the definition of the Summary Plan.
- Revise the Goals, Policies, and Objectives to include stronger language regarding the promotion/coordination of waste reduction/diversion programs.
- Revise wording and technical data to be consistent with the data in the Siting Element where applicable.

EIR

- Revise Table ES-4 on page ES-10 to address the issue of geological problems and seismicity.
- ♦ Revise maps on page 5-3 with regard to coastal lowlands.
- ♦ Revise and update page 4-3 fault map.

Revise last paragraph of Chapter 10 to discuss impacts of the planning process and that the process does not in and of itself allow for the development of any facility.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:08 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Under Item VI, Betsey Landis requested that "bailing" be revised to "baling", and under Item VII, Clarence Gieck stated that the identified agency name be revised to "Air Pollution Control District."

The October 17, 1996 minutes were then approved as amended.

III. REPORT FROM THE PLAN REVIEW SUBCOMMITTEE

Mike Mohajer reported that the Subcommittee met last Monday to consider the HHWE for the City of South Pasadena and the NDFE for the City of San Gabriel, and comments on these documents were forwarded to the Cities.

Clarence Gieck requested that documentation for all future Subcommittee meetings be provided to the Task Force members at least 10 days in advance of each meeting.

IV. REPORT FROM THE FACILITY REVIEW SUBCOMMITTEE

Richard Hanson reported that the Subcommittee met this morning to consider granting a Finding of Conformance to the Pebbly Beach Landfill on Santa Catalina Island.

Dave Smith referred to the staff report (Attachment A) and reported that the facility is undergoing modifications and wishes to increase the maximum elevation from 200 to 230 above mean sea level.

Mr. Smith stated that the facility is an existing Class III landfill, incorporating incineration at the facility as a condition of their existing Conditional Use Permit. The facility has been in operation prior to 1976, therefore, the facility was grandfathered into the existing County Solid Waste Management Plan.

Mr. Smith reported that staff's recommendations were modified during the Subcommittee meeting (which have been incorporated in Attachment A), and read the revised recommendations to the members of the Task Force.

Mr. Hanson stated that the Subcommittee recommends that the FOC be granted to the project proponent. A motion was introduced and approved to grant an FOC to the Pebbly Beach Landfill. Motion carried unanimously.

V. REPORT ON THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' ACTION OF OCTOBER 15, 1996, REGARDING THE COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT

Mr. Mohajer distributed copies of the minutes of the Board of Supervisors' meeting of October 15, 1996 (Attachment B) and reported that the motion directs the Department of Public Works and requests the local Task Force, as a part of processing the final draft of the Countywide Siting Element, to consider alternative technologies to landfilling and attempt to address those issues in the Siting Element along with the other conditions listed on Page 3, under Item B.

Mr. Mohajer stated that staff is currently preparing the final draft of the Siting Element and recommended that an additional joint meeting of the Task Force and the Plan Review Subcommittee be held to review the final draft Siting Element prior to its submittal to the Board of Supervisors. Mr. Mohajer also stated that the final draft document will go directly to all cities in the County for a 90-day approval/disapproval period, and must also come before the Task Force during this period. Mr. Mohajer reported that the deadline for submittal of the document will be the end of January 1997. After some discussion, it was determined that a special joint meeting would be held sometime during January 1997.

Mr. Mohajer reported that Mission-Rustic-Sullivan Canyons will not be included in the final Siting Element as potential landfill sites due to Federal law which prohibits the development of new landfills in the National Park System. However, Elsmere, Towsley, and Blind Canyons will remain in the Siting Element as potential landfill sites.

Mr. Mohajer stated that the issue of composting will be discussed by the Board of Supervisors on December 12, 1996, 9:30 a.m., in reference to the BioGro Composting Facility.

Mr. Mohajer reported that the City of Santa Clarita and also the group known as the Alliance for Innovative Resource Management (AFIRM) prepared a report entitled, "Approaching an Integrated Solid Waste Management System for Los Angeles County." The report was prepared by GBB, Inc., at the cost of \$150,000 financed by the City of

> Mr. Mohajer stated that the report Santa Clarita. consists of a series of alternatives/assumptions, and based on these assumptions, the report concludes that Los Angeles County does not require additional landfill disposal capacity and that the existing capacity is sufficient through the year 2023. Mr. Mohajer relayed the following strategies as identified in the document: the analysis provided in the Countywide Siting Element should consider average tonnages rather than maximum permitted tonnages; ignore all wasteshed boundaries; the 6,000 tons capacity available in Orange County landfills be reserved for Los Angeles County jurisdictions; waste generation per capita would decline following the same pattern of the 1990-94 recession; and that economic/taxable sales will have no impact on waste generation, and that waste generation is only a function of population. Mr. Mohajer also reported that GBB stated in their report that the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Action Plan, adopted by the Board in 1988, was prepared only for the purpose of "minimizing" recycling, source reduction, composting, and other waste diversion activities. Mr. Mohajer stated that GBB has made waste generation projections for the year 2010 through 2043, based on the Department's 15-year disposal capacity projections and attributed these to the Siting Element. Mr. Mohajer also stated that GBB's report recommends adoption of a 70% diversion mandate; a land disposal ban on certain types of materials, including inert waste; and promotes the use of alternative daily cover.

VI. PRESENTATION ON ALTERNATIVE DISPOSAL TECHNOLOGIES BY LORY E. LARSON, SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON

Mr. Larson gave a presentation to the members of the Task Force regarding alternative technologies for refuse. Audio is available upon request.

VII. NEXT MEETING DATE

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for December 19, 1996, 1:00 p.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The September 19, 1996 minutes were approved as presented.

Mike Mohajer introduced Dr. John Robertson, recently appointed to the Task Force by the League of California Cities.

III. REPORT OF CLOSURE OF LANDFILLS IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY

Mr. Mohajer reported that BKK Landfill closed on September 14, 1996, Lopez Canyon closed during July of 1996, and Azusa Landfill no longer accepts organic waste as of October 3, 1996, however, the facility continues to operate as an inert waste landfill.

Mr. Mohajer stated that Puente Hills Landfill is operating at maximum daily capacity and is accepting approximately 13,000 tons of waste per day. Spadra Landfill has a 15,000 tons per week limit, and the facility is closing each day between 1:30 and 3:00 p.m. Azusa, while accepting organic waste, was accepting up to 2,500 tons of waste per day, now that waste is being landfilled elsewhere. Sunshine Canyon has been operating since August 1996, and is receiving approximately 3,500 tons of waste per day. Bradley West has recently been receiving approximately 7,000 tons of waste per day.

Mr. Mohajer also stated that Western Waste has reported that approximately 1,000 tons per day of Los Angeles County waste is shipped to Orange County landfills. Additionally, waste from Orange County is shipped to Riverside County, due to reduced tipping fees.

Mr. Mohajer reported that, from a mathematical stand point, daily permitted disposal capacity will be available in Los Angeles County until the end of the century.

IV. STATUS REPORT, COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT AND COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY PLAN

Mr. Mohajer stated that under State law, all counties are required to prepare a Countywide Siting Element, which must address 15 years of disposal capacity for the unincorporated areas, as well as all cities within each

county. Disposal capacity, under State law, is defined as that capacity available for solid waste disposal through landfilling and transformation facilities, which includes incineration, waste-to-energy, etc. Under State law, composting has been excluded.

Mr. Mohajer reported that the Summary Plan, another document that must be prepared by counties, must summarize all the waste diversion programs that have been identified by all jurisdictions within in each county.

Mr. Mohajer stated that these documents have been prepared and submitted for public review during March of 1996. The 45-day review period was subsequently extended by an additional 45-day period as requested by various cities. Then, the second 45-day review period was further extended by 120-days, as requested by the City of Los Angeles. Altogether, both documents have been out for public review for 210 days, today being the last day of the last extension period.

Mr. Mohajer reported that the U.S. Congress enacted legislation last Thursday which prohibits the U.S. Forest from transferring properties within the Angeles National Forest for the purpose of landfilling. A major portion of the proposed Elsmere Canyon Landfill footprint is located in the Angeles National Forest area. Based on this action, the design of the landfill as completed prior to this enactment, must be revised. However, the enactment of this legislation does not mean that Elsmere Canyon Landfill is being eliminated from consideration, nor excluded from the Siting Element, but it does mean that the capacity of the proposed landfill will be revised. Mr. Mohajer also reported that the applicant for the proposed landfill has filed a valid request with the County Department of Regional Planning for redesign of the proposed project, and the project proponent's position is that the project is still very much alive.

Mr. Mohajer stated that in reference to the actions of Congress, Supervisor Antonovich made a motion that directs the Department of Public Works, along with the Task Force, to work together to move forward with identifying and looking for alternative technologies to include rail-haul as well as expansion of existing facilities in this County (copy attached). Mr. Mohajer then distributed copies of the Department's response to Supervisor Antonovich's motion (copy attached).

In conclusion, Mr. Mohajer stated that all public comments will be addressed in the final draft of the Siting Element, which will be prepared by December 1996.

V. PRESENTATION BY LYLE TALBOT AND JANE WILLIAMS ON SEWAGE SLUDGE MANAGEMENT

Mr. Lyle Talbot and Ms. Jane Williams, of High Desert Citizens Against Pollution, gave presentations to the Task Force regarding sewage sludge management. Audio is available upon request.

VI. PRESENTATION ON LANDFILL TECHNIQUES, BALING, BY D. CHRISTMAN

Mr. D. Christman gave a presentation to the members of the Task Force. Audio is available upon request.

VII. OPEN DISCUSSION

Clarence Gieck gave a brief update on the formation of a new Air Pollution Control District in the Antelope Valley.

Dave Smith reported that the Department's contractor for the Curbside Recycling Program recently completed its public education outreach activities, and stated that the computerized kiosk, featuring the Recycle & Win game, is now on display in the HQ lobby.

Mr. Mohajer reported that a representative from Edison Company will give a presentation on transformation processes at the next meeting of the Task Force.

VIII. NEXT MEETING DATE

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for November 21, 1996, 1:00 p.m.

Dave Smith stated that the City mentioned the composting facility at Bradley Landfill, however, recent submittals to staff regarding the landfill do not indicate that a composting facility exists. Therefore, the City has been asked to clarify the issue.

IV. REPORT FROM THE FACILITY REVIEW SUBCOMMITTEE

Consideration of Granting a Revised Finding of Conformance to the Culver City Transfer Station (Attachment A).

Mr. Avoian stated that the Subcommittee met earlier this morning to consider granting a revised FOC to the project proponent. Mr. Avoian stated that the Subcommittee voted unanimously to recommend to the Task Force to grant the FOC.

A motion was introduced and approved to grant a revised FOC to the Culver City Transfer Station. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Avoian also reported that the Subcommittee recommends that a policy resolution be adopted by the Task Force to direct staff not to accept any FOC requests unless all filings have been submitted to the State Clearinghouse and County/City Clerk. After some discussion, a motion was introduced and approved to adopt the recommended policy by the Subcommittee. Motion carried unanimously.

V. PRESENTATION BY PARCO RECYCLING

Barry Takallou, Parco Recycling, gave a presentation to the Task Force regarding tire recycling. Audio is available upon request.

Discussion ensued regarding a possible visit by the Task Force members to the Parco Recycling Facility.

VI. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Mike Mohajer reported that the Sacramento County Superior Court previously rendered a ruling that use of green waste as ADC will now be considered as disposal. AB 2323 (Sher), which would allow green waste used as landfill cover to be counted as recycled waste, has passed the Assembly and is now before the Senate Committee on Governmental Organizations and is due to be heard on June 25. AB 1647 (Bustamonte), which would provide recycling credit for materials used at landfill sites for productive use, such as street resurfacing, is also due to be heard by the Senate Committee on June 25. SB 1535 (Clay), which extends the sunset clause on providing funding to recycling market development zones, has been extend from July 1997, to July 2006.

Mr. Mohajer stated that AB 2706 provides 100% diversion credit for existing waste-to-energy facilities. Under current State law, facilities would only receive 10% diversion credit for the 50% diversion for the year 2000. Charlie Tripp stated that this bill has passed in the Senate.

V. OPEN DISCUSSION/PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Mohajer stated that the public review period for the Siting Element and the Summary Plan concluded on June 17, 1996. Mr. Mohajer also stated staff has received numerous requests for an extension of the review period by an additional 120 days, and the request is under review at this time. Mr. Mohajer reported that the Los Angeles City Council has requested that the County remove Mission-Rustic-Sullivan, Lopez Canyon, and Sunshine Canyon from the Siting Element.

Regarding the Summary Plan, Mr. Mohajer also reported that staff has received numerous requests from various cities to revise the document to develop a truly, integrated waste management system for the County as well as the 88 cities (copies distributed).

Clarence Gieck introduced a motion requesting that documentation for all future Committee and Subcommittee meetings be provided to the Task Force members at least 10 days in advance of each meeting. Motion was approved and carried unanimously.

Mr. Avoian also stated that a discussion ensued during the Subcommittee meeting regarding a staff condition in the FOC which requests information regarding recovered/diverted materials and final destination of said materials. Mr. Avoian reported that staff will research this matter to verify if this information is required by law, and will report their findings to the Subcommittee at a later date.

IV. CONSIDERATION OF THE REVIEW PROCESS FOR THE PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF THE COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, THE PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF THE COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY PLAN, THE DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR THE SITING ELEMENT, AND THE PROPOSED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE SUMMARY PLAN

Mike Mohajer reported that State law and regulations have mandated certain responsibilities to the local Task Force. Pursuant to State law, the Task Force is required to provide assistance to the County in preparation of the Siting Element and the Summary Plan, as well as development of the Goals, Policies, and Objectives for the above documents. State law also requires the County to submit these draft documents to the local Task Force for a 45-day review and comment period, ending May 1, 1996. Mr. Mohajer indicated that the Task Force should review and discuss these documents during the April meeting.

> Mr. Mohajer also reported that based on comments received during the 45-day review period, final draft documents which incorporate prepared comments/questions. At that time, the documents will again be submitted to the Task Force for review. documents will then be submitted to the Board of Supervisors in order to obtain authorization to release to the cities for the 90-day documents approval/disapproval period. Subject to receiving approval by a majority of the cities containing a majority of the incorporated population in Los Angeles County, the documents will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for adoption. At that point, the documents will then be submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for their review and approval. approval is not obtained from the majority of the cities containing the majority of the incorporated population, the documents must be revised and recirculated.

> Mr. Mohajer stated that if a city were to disapprove the document(s), the city must conduct a public hearing for which advertisement for the hearing is placed in local newspapers 30 days in advance, and the city must adopt a formal resolution, indicating the reason for disapproval of the document(s).

Mr. Mohajer requested direction from the Task Force regarding the review process, and whether the Task Force will direct the Plan Review Subcommittee to review the draft documents, or if the Task Force itself will be directly involved in the process. After some discussion, a motion was introduced and approved for the Task Force, along with the Plan Review Subcommittee, to review and comment on the draft documents. Motion carried unanimously.

Additionally, the next meeting of the Task Force has been rescheduled for Wednesday, April 17, 1996, at 10:00 a.m.

V. UPDATE FROM THE PUBLIC EDUCATION AND INFORMATION SUBCOMMITTEE

VII. OPEN DISCUSSION/PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Mohajer reported that staff has received fourth quarter 1995 disposal quantity reports from all permitted solid waste facilities in Los Angeles County, and that information will be submitted to jurisdictions in the next couple of weeks. Total reported disposal quantity for 1995 was slightly more than 12 million tons, which is approximately % million tons less than 1994.

Total disposal quantity reported for 1990 was 15,912,000 tons. However, total disposal quantities for all jurisdictions, as reported in the submitted Source Reduction and Recycling Elements, during 1990 was approximately 10-11 million tons, signifying an approximate 30% error. Mr. Mohajer stated that this base year discrepancy is a major issue, therefore, a committee has been formed by the California Integrated Waste Management Board to address this concern.

Hal Croyts referred to the article in the Sacramento Bee (attached) regarding green waste diversion credits. Mr. Mohajer reported that the judge's decision will have a major impact on all jurisdictions in Los Angeles County. The CIWMB is appealing the Superior Court decision, and legislation (AB 2323) was introduced by Byron Sher, prior to the February 23, 1996 decision, which will provide credit for the use of green waste as landfill alternative daily cover. Mr. Mohajer stated that the Department has made a recommendation to support AB 2323.

Marsha McLean, S.C.V. Canyons Preservation Committee, asked if the Negative Declaration takes into consideration, when discussing certain landfills, unmitigable circumstances. Mr. Mohajer stated that the proposed Negative Declaration only addresses the Summary Plan, which is a compilation of information provided by all cities in Los Angeles County, as presented in the SRRES, HHWES, and NDFES.

Ms. McLean also asked for clarification regarding disparity between 1990 and 1995 disposal quantity totals. Mr. Mohajer stated that the County numbers are correct. The numbers in error are those indicated in the SRREs. Disposal quantities reported for 1995 were 12 million tons; in 1990, disposal quantities were 15,900,000 tons. The SRREs which identified disposal quantities for each jurisdiction, when added together equal a little more than 10 million tons.

Ms. McLean stated that it has been the City of Santa Clarita's position that the County's number has been overinflated for 1990. Mr. Mohajer went on to explain again that the numbers reported in the SRREs were underestimated. The 1995 disposal quantities substantiate that the SRREs' 1990 disposal quantities were in error.

VIII. NEXT MEETING DATE

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:08 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The January 18, 1996 minutes were approved as written.

III. CONSIDERATION OF GRANTING A FINDING OF CONFORMANCE TO THE NU-WAY LIVE OAK LANDFILL

Al Avoian reported that the Subcommittee met earlier this morning to review the Finding of Conformance for the Nu-Way Live Oak Landfill. Mr. Avoian stated that the Subcommittee recommends that the Task Force grant the FOC to the project proponent, subject to staff recommendations.

Dave Smith referred to the revised staff report (Attachment A) and stated this version supersedes previous copies of the report. Mr. Smith stated that the site consists of 70.6 acres, of which, 57 acres will be filled and brought to surrounding grade. The maximum operating daily capacity of the facility is expected to be 6,000 tons per day.

A motion was introduced and approved to grant an FOC to the Nu-Way Live Oak Landfill. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. DISCUSSION OF PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETINGS RELATING TO THE COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, THE COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT, THE COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY PLAN, AND THE COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY PLAN NEGATIVE DECLARATION

Mike Mohajer reported that the above-mentioned documents are ready for release to all cities, neighboring counties, governmental agencies, and public interest groups for a 45-day review period. The documents will also be available for review at all County and city libraries and all district offices of the Department. As mandated by State law, the Department will be conducting 12 public information meetings throughout the County and ads will be placed in local newspapers notifying the public of the scheduled information meetings.

> Mr. Mohajer asked the Task Force members to assist staff in conducting the public information meetings. Al Avoian, Betsey Landis, Clarence Gieck, and Lois Shade agreed to participate.

> John McTaggart, Rancho Palos Verdes, volunteered to place information regarding the meetings on the City's "Net". Al Avoian suggested that the information should be made available to other cities with similar technology.

Ruth Ray offered to speak with "media contacts" to obtain public relations for the public information meetings.

Mr. Mohajer also stated that Fact Sheets, providing very basic information of the documents, will be prepared and distributed to the Task Force members, along with the final schedule of the information meetings.

Ted Rogers, City of Los Angeles, asked for information regarding the documents and the approval process. Mr. Mohajer reported that the Siting Element addresses solid waste disposal needs of all 88 cities in Los Angeles County, as well as the County unincorporated communities, for a 15-year planning period. The Summary Plan summarizes the Source Reduction and Recycling Elements, Household Hazardous Waste Elements, and Non-Disposal Facility Elements adopted by each of the 89 jurisdictions in the County. The draft documents are subject to public review for a minimum of 45 days. Based on comments received, draft final documents must be prepared within 105 days after the closure of the 45-day public review period. The final drafts must be submitted to all cities for approval/disapproval. The documents must be approved by a majority of the cities containing a majority of the incorporated population in Los Angeles County. Assuming approval, the documents will then be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for adoption. Finally, the documents will be submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for their approval. If approval is not obtained from the majority of the cities containing the majority of the incorporated population, the documents must be revised recirculated.

Joe Massey recommended that the information be made available to the public through computer diskettes. After some discussion, it was determined that staff will look into the matter.

V. OPEN DISCUSSION/PUBLIC COMMENT

Betsey Landis gave a brief overview of the Manual of California Vegetation, which replaces the Holland Code and will be used for determining site vegetation in future EIRs and CEQA processes.

Mr. Mohajer stated that the Board of Supervisors directed staff to prepare a report regarding solid waste management throughout the United States. The findings of the report indicate: 1) no jurisdiction has been able to achieve 50% diversion, 2) diversion measurement methodologies differ from one jurisdiction to another, and 3) the most realistic alternative to landfills consists of waste-to-energy facilities, however, siting such facilities are currently cost-prohibitive.

VI. NEXT MEETING DATE

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for March 21, 1996, 1:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 1:15 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The February 13, 1995 minutes were approved as written.

III. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, CHAPTER 4, CURRENT DISPOSAL RATE AND ASSESSMENT OF DISPOSAL CAPACITY NEEDS

Mike Mohajer stated that Chapters 7, 8, and 10 will be hand-delivered on Thursday, and the next Subcommittee meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 6, 1995.

Mr. Mohajer stated that the Subcommittee reviewed this chapter last week, and based on the comments provided, staff has made a number of revisions/changes to the Mr. Mohajer reported that for projection of document. waste quantities through the year 2010, staff will be using population projections, based on the data available from the State Department of Finance, and employment Mr. Mohajer stated that using projections from SCAG. population and employment and no other factors projecting waste generation and disposal has caused him The adjustment methodology formula, much concern. developed and adopted by the State as part of the regulations to project 1995 and 2000 generation, considers employment, population, CPI, and taxable sales. In other words, there is no direct relationship between Unfortunately, data on population and employment. taxable sales and the CPI projected through the year 2010 is not available. The State Department of Finance has a projected number for the whole State, but not the County, for the year 2000, but nothing up to the year 2010, and the CPI projection has not been developed. Using the higher result in substantially wrong data may projections, which may make it very difficult to justify.

Mr. Mohajer stated that staff will be contacting various financial institutes in an attempt to derive CPI and employment projections, and based on that information, staff will attempt to use the adjustment methodology developed by the State. It was determined that this matter will be further discussed at a later date.

Mr. Mohajer reminded the Subcommittee that all waste disposal quantities listed in the draft chapter are preliminary, and are subject to change prior to actual publication of the draft CSE.

Mr. Mohajer reported that Chapter 4 includes various time-to-crisis analysis scenarios. After much discussion, it was determined that only scenarios A-D, in conjunction with waste generation projections, will be included in the draft chapter.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 4, subject to review of the aforementioned projections. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, CHAPTER 5, FACILITY SITING CRITERIA

Mr. Mohajer stated that Chapter 5 refers to Appendix 5-A, which is the Siting Criteria previously reviewed. In addition, the chapter provides an overview of the various permit requirements and the agencies and processes involved, and public participation during the permitting process.

Mr. Mohajer stated that in reference to Section 5.5.6.3, Administrative Process, staff will have the LEA review this section and incorporate their comments, if any, in the draft chapter.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 5. Motion carried unanimously.

V. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, CHAPTER 6, PROPOSED IN-COUNTY FACILITY LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

Mr. Mohajer stated that chapter 6 identifies in-County facilities that would be needed in order for the County to be able to provide 15 years of disposal capacity. Mr. Mohajer stated that background information regarding the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Action Plan has been included in the draft chapter, along with a brief overview of the study previously conducted by the County Sanitation Districts, the Department of Public Works, and the Elsmere Corporation, in identifying possible facility sites. Mr. Mohajer stated that after careful consideration of 151 possible sites, four sites appear to be potentially suitable for Class III landfill Blind, Elsmere, Mission-Rustic-Sullivan, and Towsley Canyons. Mr. Mohajer also stated that the alternative site study will be included as an appendix to the chapter.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 6. Motion carried 4-1. Mike Miller was not present at time of vote.

VI. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, CHAPTER 9, FINDING OF CONFORMANCE

Mr. Mohajer reported that State law mandates that once the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan is approved, no new solid waste facilities or the expansion of existing solid waste facilities can occur without the Siting Element being amended (approved by the majority of the cities containing the majority of incorporated population). In this document, a clause has been added, stating that the FOC process will provide a mechanism to facility expansions or new facility sites to the Siting Element without having to go back through the above-referenced approval process.

It was determined that reference to land use permit requirements be included in Table 9-1; Section 9.4, Applicability of Finding of Conformance, Definition of Significant Change, "is defined as any change in the operation of a solid waste disposal facility that requires compliance with the requirements of California Environmental Quality Act, as amended; any increase in daily permitted capacity as defined in Chapter 3 of the CSD: or any increase in quantity of solid waste delivered to the facility for the purpose of storage, diversion/salvage and/or disposal as listed in an existing FOC granted by the Task Force.", the CSD will provide comments regarding this definition to staff prior to or at the next Subcommittee meeting; Section 9.5, Administrative Process, will be clarified; and Section 9.6.2, Conditional Finding of Conformance, will be deleted from the chapter.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 9. Motion carried unanimously.

- 2. Section 3.3.4, Permitted Solid Waste Disposal Capacity, Permitted Capacity, revise paragraph to be similar with the following paragraph regarding restrictions on amounts received.
- 3. Section 3.4, Solid Waste Disposal Facilities in Los Angeles County, Major Class III Landfill, change definition to read:...which is permitted to receive 250,000 tons or more of solid waste per year.

- 4. Section 3.4, Solid Waste Disposal Facilities in Los Angeles County, Small Class III Landfill, change definition to read:...which is permitted to receive less than 250,000 tons of solid waste per year.
- 5. Section 3.4.1, Class III Landfills, revise page 3-6 according to the above-mentioned revisions.
- 6. Section 3.5, Fact Sheets and Map, page 3-8, revise paragraph to reflect that the conversion factor relates to Class III landfills.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 3, subject to the revisions suggested by the Subcommittee. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, CHAPTER 4, DISPOSAL CAPACITY REQUIREMENTS

The Subcommittee reviewed the draft version of Chapter 4 (Attachment B) and requested staff to make the following revisions/corrections:

- Throughout the chapter, revise to read tons, yards.

- 3. All disposal quantities will be revised at the time the document is finalized.

- 5. Section 4.5.2, Class III Landfills, Definition of Time-to-Crisis, will be revised by Mike Mohajer.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 4, subject to the revisions suggested by the Subcommittee with the exception of Section 4.6, which will be reviewed when expanded by staff. Motion carried unanimously.

V. OPEN DISCUSSION

Subsequently, the City of Santa Clarita has requested that the comment period for the draft EIR/EIR be extended for an additional year. The County Regional Planning Commission will be conducting a public hearing on the draft EIR/EIS on May 10, 1995, at their downtown headquarters, and on May 31, a hearing will be conducted at Placerita Junior High School.

Steve Maguin reported that the County Sanitation Districts had a public hearing two weeks ago on Countywide cumulative impacts of waste-by-rail and that approximately 18 people showed up.

Under the Goals and Objectives Component, Russell Bukoff reported that the City is part of the Garbage Disposal District and the City states in each component of the plan that all programs in the document are intended to augment the GDD's objectives.

Under the Recycling Component, Mr. Bukoff stated that the City discusses a possible use of a MRF, and that it's credited with approximately 20% of diversion activities for the City. However, the City does not mention any agreements that have been arranged with any specific facility.

Under the Composting Component, Mr. Bukoff reported that the City intends to develop and implement decentralized preprocessing and materials storage sites in the short-term, although the City makes no commitment to a site within its jurisdiction, and that the City has identified UPC in Santa Fe Springs as a preprocessing facility that may be used.

Under the Disposal Capacity Component, Mr. Bukoff stated that the City will seek to secure written export agreements with receiving jurisdictions.

Under the Recycling program, Mr. Bukoff stated that the City has implemented single- and multi-family curbside collection programs, however, these are considered as contingency programs if the MRF is not implemented.

Mike Mohajer stated that the City of Bell Gardens is located within the Belvedere GDD, and that a curbside recycling program is in existence for single-family and duplexes, along with a greenwaste These programs are also collection program. available for all multi-family residential, commercial, and industrial establishments upon request by the property owners. Mr. Mohajer stated that since the City is within the GDD, it limits the City's control over solid waste, and that State special districts. is silent regarding Mr. Mohajer stated that the City has done all that it can do under the current circumstances.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the final SRRE for the City of Bell Gardens, subject to the comments of the Subcommittee. Motion carried unanimously.

B. Final Draft HHWE for the City of Bell Gardens (Attachment B)

Mr. Bukoff stated that the City will participate in the Countywide Household Hazardous Waste Program, and that the City will implement education and public information activities.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the final HHWE for the City of Bell Gardens. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, CHAPTER 1, INTRODUCTION

Mr. Mohajer distributed copies of a memorandum from the Department of Regional Planning to the Board of Supervisors regarding waste management strategies (Attachment C) and gave the following update:

Last summer, Waste Management Inc. decided to import waste from San Diego County to the Antelope Valley (Lancaster Landfill) which caused much distress for local residents. Subsequently, a motion was introduced by Supervisor Antonovich that would prohibit the importation of solid waste into Los Angeles County. The motion was not passed, but the Board of Supervisors directed the County Regional Planning Commission to conduct public hearings to receive comments from the public regarding the importation and exportation of solid waste, and to see if they could come up with some strategies in dealing with this issue. As a result of this motion, the Department of Regional Planning conducted two public hearings in Lancaster and Los Angeles. Mr. Mohajer then referred to the first paragraph of page 7 and stated that a recommendation has been made that the County should assess flow control issues in the Integrated Waste This issue will be addressed in Management Plan. subsequent chapters of the draft CSE.

After much discussion, the Subcommittee reviewed the draft version of Chapter 1 (Attachment D). A motion was introduced and approved to accept the draft version of Chapter 1, provided that all solid waste estimated amounts be inserted in the final version and that the amount of solid waste being disposed daily at landfills (page 1-3) be adjusted accordingly. Motion carried unanimously.

V. REVIEW OF THE DRAFT COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT, SITING CRITERIA

Mr. Mohajer stated that the Siting Criteria may become a part of, or an appendix to, Chapter 5.

The Subcommittee reviewed the Siting Criteria (Attachment E) and instructed staff to revise page A-21 to be consistent with Subtitle D regulations, and to move pages A-41 and 42 to the beginning of the Siting Criteria. It was also noted that mitigation measures will be included at a later date. A motion was then introduced and approved to accept the draft Siting Criteria. Motion carried unanimously.

Dave Smith referred to Attachment A and stated that staff has only informational comments.

Mr. Smith reported that the City will participate in the Countywide Household Hazardous Waste Program, and that they will continue the operation of their mobile HHW collection program and the Lopez Canyon HHW exclusion program.

Mr. Smith stated that the City will supplement the program with additional brochures, flyers, presentations, community outreach, advertising, etc. Mr. Smith also stated that the City has filed a Negative Declaration for their CEQA documentation.

A motion was introduced and approved to accept the final draft HHWE for the City of Los Angeles. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. DISCUSSION ON THE COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT -- GOALS AND POLICIES

Mike Mohajer reported the following:

Assembly Bill 939 requires that the County prepare a Countywide Siting Element which provides a mechanism for 15 years of disposal needs for the 88 cities in

Los Angeles County, as well as the unincorporated communities. The document must be submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board by August 1, 1995, 12 months after the date that the regulations were approved by the State Office of Administrative Law.

The draft document must be submitted to cities for a 45-day review period and public information meetings must also be conducted. Based on the comments of the draft document, the final draft must be prepared and submitted to the cities for a 90-day approval/disapproval process. The cities can either approve, disapprove, or not take action, which will result in tacit approval, of the document. Should a city elect to approve/disapprove the document, this action must be achieved through a resolution, and prior to adopting this resolution, the city must conduct a public hearing.

After the document has been approved by the majority of the cities containing a majority of the incorporated populations, it will be submitted to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors for their approval, and ultimately to the CIWMB for their approval.

One of the requirements of State law is that the Task Force is to assist the County in the development of goals and policies for the Siting Element. Regulations specifically define goals and policies as listed in Chapter 2 of the CSE (Attachment B).

Al Avoian asked when the draft CSE will be completed and when will the Subcommittee be able to review it. Mr. Mohajer stated that due to the State's short deadline, staff may have to submit draft copies of the CSE to the Subcommittee members, chapter by chapter for review. Currently, it is proposed that the draft CSE and draft EIR will be completed by March 1995.

- 1. The City of Santa Clarita does not support the permitting and development of Elsmere Canyon.
- 2. The City of Santa Clarita does not support the permitting and development of Blind and Towsley Canyons.
- 3. The Cities of Los Angeles and Santa Clarita do not support the permitting and development of Mission/Rustic/Sullivan Canyons.
- 4. The City of Los Angeles may oppose the expansion of Lopez Canyon Landfill.
- 5. The City of Los Angeles may oppose the expansion of Sunshine Canyon Landfill.

After further discussion and without making any changes to Subsection 2.4.1, the Subcommittee continued with the review of the remaining document, and instructed staff to make minor revisions to the document (which have been incorporated into Attachment B).

Subsequently, a motion was introduced and approved to approve the draft version of Chapter 2, Goals and Policies. Motion carried 5-2.

At its meeting held October 15, 1996, the Board took the following action:

Supervisor Antonovich made the following statement:

"Thursday's announcement that Congress passed legislation to preclude the transfer of U.S. Forest lands to Browning Ferris Industries (BFI) for use as the proposed Elsmere Canyon landfill is good news for the residents of the Santa Clarita Valley and those of us who question the propriety of urban landfills.

"Passage of the legislation calls attention once again to the need for this County to aggressively pursue alternative waste disposal strategies and out-of-County solutions to our waste disposal needs. In the past few months, I have obtained Board approval of motions to protect existing landfill capacities and to seek contracts for landfill space in adjacent counties.

"The Department of Public Works is currently preparing its final Siting Element which looks primarily to landfills within the County to meet our needs. However, State law permits counties to use other strategies to address our needs when we find that existing capacity is insufficient to meet our needs and no other areas are available to meet these needs."

Therefore, Supervisor Antonovich made a motion that the Director of Public Works and the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force reexamine the draft plan for the Solid Waste Siting Element in light of the Federal prohibition against the use of Angeles Forest lands for the Elsmere Canyon Landfill; and include aggressive programs to protect existing County space, maximize the use of rail haul and develop waste-to-energy and other innovative solutions to meet the County's needs in the final draft Solid Waste Siting Element prior to its submittal to the Board.

As a part of this State mandate, the Task Force also developed a number of Countywide goals, policies, and objectives which are listed in the documents. The Task Force membership includes representatives from the California League of Cities, Los Angeles County Division; appointees of the County Board of Supervisors and the City of Los Angeles; and representatives of industries, environmental groups, and the general public. The Task

Force membership was approved by the County Board of Supervisors on July 10, 1990, upon concurrence by the majority of the cities in Los Angeles County containing the majority of the County incorporated population.

As required by State law, the Siting Element addresses the solid waste disposal needs of all 88 cities in Los Angeles County, as well as the unincorporated communities in Los Angeles County, for a 15-year planning period (1996 through 2010). The document describes existing conditions, estimates future disposal needs, and makes recommendations on how to meet these needs on a Countywide basis. The Siting Element also identifies the areas for the location of potential new solid waste disposal facilities and potential expansion of existing solid waste disposal facilities in Los Angeles County. The document also establishes siting criteria for development of needed solid waste disposal facilities and formulates a Finding of Conformance process to determine consistency of proposed new solid waste disposal facilities and/or expansion of existing facilities with the Siting Element.

The Summary Plan provides an overview of all the Elements of the Countywide solid waste management planning process, which includes the Source Reduction and Recycling Elements, Household Hazardous Waste Elements, and Nondisposal Facility Elements of the 88 cities in Los Angeles County and the County unincorporated areas. The Summary Plan includes Countywide goals, policies, and objectives for coordinating Countywide diversion programs and marketing and disposal strategies. 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COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT FACT SHEET

LOS ANGELES COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

QUESTION 1: WHAT IS THE COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT AND ITS PURPOSE?

Answer:

State law requires cities and counties to divert (reduce) 25 percent of their solid waste from landfills and transformation (incineration) facilities by 1995 and 50 percent by the year 2000, through source reduction, recycling and composting programs. State law also has recognized that after these diversion goals are met, the remaining waste must be properly disposed of in order to protect the public health and safety. As such, State law requires counties to prepare a plan to address management of this residual waste at landfills and transformation facilities for a 15-year planning period. This plan is called the "Countywide Siting Element" (Siting Element). State law also provides for a penalty of \$10,000 per day on a County that fails to prepare this document.

The purpose of the Countywide Siting Element is to provide a planning mechanism to address the disposal needs of the 88 cities and the County unincorporated areas in Los Angeles County for a 15-year planning period.

QUESTION 2: WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF THE SITING ELEMENT?

Answer:

The draft Siting Element has been prepared consistent with the following goals:

- Protect the health, welfare, and safety of all citizens by identifying how Los Angeles County may provide for the disposal needs of residents in the 88 cities and the unincorporated communities during the 15-year planning period. This may be done through development of environmentally and technically feasible landfill and/or transformation (incineration) facilities in and/or out of the County for solid waste which remains after recycling and composting.
- Protect the economic well-being of Los Angeles County by ensuring that the County is served by an efficient and economical public/private solid waste disposal system.
- Establish siting criteria that provides for the environmentally and technically feasible development of landfills and/or transformation (incineration) facilities.
- Reduce the quantities of solid waste in need of disposal through source reduction, recycling, composting, and public education.
- Supplement and extend the life of in-County disposal capacity by promoting the development and use of remote out-of-County landfill sites and/or transformation facilities, and the necessary in-County loading facilities to provide access to these sites.

QUESTION 3: WHAT IS SOLID WASTE?

Answer:

Solid waste includes garbage, trash, refuse, paper, rubbish, plastic, glass, cardboard, demolition and construction wastes, manure, vegetable wastes, animal wastes, and other discarded wastes.

Solid waste does not include hazardous waste (toxic, corrosive, irritant, and/or explosive) liquid, medical, and radioactive wastes.

${f Q}$ UESTION 4: WHAT IS A SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITY?

Answer:

A facility that accepts solid waste for land disposal, or a transformation facility whose principal function is to convert, combust, or otherwise process solid waste by incineration, etc. As defined by State law, transformation does not include composting or biomass conversion.

QUESTION 5:

WHAT INPUT DOES THE GENERAL PUBLIC HAVE ON THE CONTENT OF THE SITING ELEMENT?

Answer:

Public involvement in the planning process is extremely important to the proper development of the Siting Element. For this reason, public information meetings have been scheduled throughout Los Angeles County to request the public's input on this document. The meetings are to be an exchange of knowledge, information, and concerns in addressing the solid waste disposal need of the 88 cities in Los Angeles County and its unincorporated communities.

QUESTION 6:

WHO PREPARED THE SITING ELEMENT?

Answer:

The Draft Siting Element has been prepared by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works in coordination with the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force (Task Force) and incorporates comments by the Task Force. The Task Force developed the goals, policies, and procedures to provide guidance to the Department of Public Works to prepare the Siting Element.

QUESTION 7:

WHAT IS THE TASK FORCE?

Answer:

State law requires that each county assemble a local task force to, among other things, assist and advise the county agency responsible for preparing the Siting Element. In 1990, the cities within Los Angeles County and the County Board of Supervisors created the Task Force.

The Task Force consists of 17 voting members, each of whom is knowledgeable in one or more aspects of solid waste management or in such related fields as environmental quality, resource or energy conservation, and land use. The Task Force membership includes appointees of the Cities in Los Angeles County, the County Board of Supervisors, solid waste industries, environmental groups, and the private sector. The Task Force is responsible for the coordination of solid waste management issues on a Countywide basis.

QUESTION 8:

HOW WILL THE PROPOSED SITING ELEMENT BE APPROVED AND ADOPTED?

Answer:

The Draft Siting Element was released for public review on March 11, 1996, and has been submitted to all 88 cities in the County; the Task Force; appropriate regional, State, and Federal governmental agencies; adjacent counties; and the public for review and comments for a 45-day period. Comments on the document will be received through May 1, 1996. Additionally, a series of public information meetings are being conducted during the review period. Upon completion of this review and comment period and based on comments received (oral and/or written), the final Draft Siting Element will be prepared in coordination with the Task Force. The final Draft Siting Element will then be forwarded

to the County Board of Supervisors prior to its release to all 88 cities for formal approval. Upon receiving approval from a majority of the cities containing more than half of the population within the 88 cities, the final Draft Siting Element will then be submitted to the County Board of Supervisors for approval. Following this action, the final Draft Siting Element will be submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) for approval. Upon approval by the CIWMB, the final Siting Element becomes effective.

It should be noted that in addition to the public information meetings conducted by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, each city and the County Board of Supervisors will hold additional public hearings prior to formal approval of the Siting Element.

QUESTION 9:

WHEN SITING A SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITY, WHAT IS THE CRITERIA CONSIDERED IN PROTECTING PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY?

Answer:

The Siting Element contains siting criteria developed to assist local jurisdictions in the permitting process of the expansion of an existing solid waste disposal facility, or a new landfill and/or transformation (incineration) facility. The objectives of the siting criteria are to protect the public health and safety and our natural resources as listed below:

- protect the residents
- protect air, surface water, and groundwater quality
- protect environmentally sensitive areas
- ensure safe transportation of solid waste
- ensure the structural stability and safety of the landfill and/or incineration facility
- protect the social and economic well being of the community

It should be noted that these criteria are not intended to replace any existing or future requirements/regulations of Federal, State, regional, and/or local agencies

QUESTION 10: HOW DOES THE SITING ELEMENT HELP TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEM OF DIMINISHING DISPOSAL CAPACITY?

Answer:

The Siting Element identifies sites which may be potentially suitable for new land disposal/incineration (transformation) facilities or expansion of existing facilities. However, prior to development of any of the sites identified in the Siting Element or any other land disposal/incineration facility, the facility owner is required to:

- Undertake a thorough site-specific assessment for the proposed project, and address all environmental concerns
- Demonstrate that the project is consistent with the applicable, local jurisdiction's General Plan
- Demonstrate that the project is in conformance with the Siting Element. As a part of the determination of conformance with the Siting Element, the Task Force must ensure compliance with the Siting Element's siting criteria and the General Plan consistency requirements.
- Satisfy the permitting requirements of local, regional, State, and Federal regulatory

agencies, such as air quality, water quality, and solid waste facility permits, and any additional requirements of the local, land use authority

REMAINING PERMITTED DISPOSAL CAPACIT SOLID WASTE FACILITIES IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 41791 of the Public Resources Code regarding the date of submission of the Countywide Siting Element and the County Integrated Waste Management Plan for Los Angeles County, the following is offered.

The citizens of Los Angeles County are currently disposing of approximately 51,000 tons (1990 average daily disposal τ six days/week) of solid waste per day. Approximately 43,245 tons of this waste are disposed of in 19 permitted Class III landfills (see Table 1, enclosed), 1,000 tons are managed by two waste-to-energy facilities (does not include the 500 tons of residual ash which is landfilled), and the remaining inert waste tons are disposed of at the permitted unclassified landfills.

At present, the remaining permitted Class III capacity in this County is estimated at 99 million tons (Table 1). Based on the 1990 average disposal rate of 43,245 tons per day (six days per week) as shown on Table 1, this capacity will be mathematically exhausted by the year 1999. However, this is misleading in that the majority of landfills have a number of restrictions which significantly impact their operations. These include expiration of the land use permit; restriction on acceptance of waste generated outside a jurisdiction and/or wasteshed boundary; permit restrictions on daily tonnage that can be accepted; and/or limitation on daily tonnage that can be handled at a facility due to lack of manpower and equipment.

At the present time, several of the operating Class III landfills have operating restrictions reducing available daily disposal capacity in the County. Burbank and Whittier (Savage Canyon) can only receive solid waste generated within their respective cities. Lopez Canyon can only receive solid waste generated by single- and multi-family residential customers within the City of Los Angeles which have been collected by City of Los Angeles Bureau of Sanitation trucks; while Puente Hills and Spadra are prohibited from receiving any waste

originating from the City of Los Angeles. Calabasas and Scholl Canyon Landfills only accept solid waste generated within defined wastesheds, while Brand Park, Pitchess Honor Rancho, and San Clemente are not open to the public.

As indicated in Table 1, Class III landfills had a permitted daily capacity of 63,950 tons in January 1991; however, this permitted capacity was reduced by 6,500 tons per day to 57,450 tons per day due to closure of Azusa Western Landfill as the result of a California Apellate Court decision. Additionally, by January 30, 1996, eight of the remaining landfills, representing 35,500 tons of permitted daily capacity, could be closed due to capacity limitations or the expiration of land use permits.

Based on the foregoing and utilizing a diversion rate of 25 percent, the County of Los Angeles will experience daily disposal capacity shortfalls within five years. Accordingly, the County will prepare and submit the CSE and the ColWMP to the Board by January 1, 1992, pursuant to requirements of Section 41791 of the PRC.

We look forward to working with you in implementing the provisions of the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989, as well as other matters of joint interest.

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APPENDIX 6-A

SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITY SITING CRITERIA

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SOLID WASTE LAND DISPOSAL AND TRANSFORMATION FACILITY SITING CRITERIA

I. SITING CRITERIA

The criteria presented herein can be used to evaluate the suitability of locations for solid waste land disposal and transformation facilities.

The criteria have been developed to assist in achieving the following objectives to safeguard the public health and safety when siting a solid waste land disposal/transformation facility. These criteria are not intended to replace any existing or future requirements/regulations mandated by Federal, State, and/or local agencies. However, these criteria have not been developed to be used for exclusionary purposes.

- Protect the residents
- Ensure the structural stability and safety of the facility
- Protect surface water
- Protect groundwater
- Protect air quality
- Protect environmentally sensitive areas
- Ensure safe transportation of solid waste
- Protect the social and economic development goals of the community

Each objective is defined in terms of a series of factors. These factors are listed in Table 5A-1. The description of each factor (pages 5A-5 through 5A-41) provides a definition of the factor, an explanation of the significance of each factor in terms of potential impacts of the facility and concerns likely to arise from the community, a set of criteria to allow application of each factor to a site, and where applicable, procedures for mitigating potential adverse impacts. For each criteria, the applicable solid waste land disposal/transformation facility is specified; unless otherwise noted, "land disposal facilities" are defined as both Class III and Unclassified (inert) landfills. It should also be recognized that some of the factors listed may not be applicable to all types of solid waste land disposal/transformation facilities, and therefore, care should be used as to the applicability of individual factors.

Both the United States Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) and the California Code of Regulations (CCR) define a sanitary landfill as "a land disposal site employing an engineered method of disposing of solid wastes on land in a manner that minimizes environmental hazards by spreading the solid wastes in thin layers, compacting the solid wastes to the smallest practical volume, and applying a compacting cover material at the end of each operating day." (40 CFR 241.101(s) & CCR Title 14, Chapter 9, Section 17225.62)

The California Public Resources Code (PRC) defines solid wastes as "all putrescible and nonputrescible solid, semi-solid, and liquid wastes, including garbage, trash, refuse, paper, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles and parts thereof, discarded home and industrial appliances, dewatered, treated, or chemically fixed sewage sludge which is not hazardous waste, manure, vegetable or animal solid and semi-solid wastes, and other discarded solid and semi-solid wastes. It does not include hazardous waste, low-level radioactive wastes or medical wastes." (PRC Section 40191)

California classifies landfills further by defining the acceptable material disposed, and the construction and safety standards for each landfill classification. These classifications are found in Title 23, Chapter 15 of the CCR, Article 2, Section 2520 et seq. As defined, Class III landfills can accept any type of non-hazardous solid waste for disposal. Unclassified landfills can accept only non-organic inert materials.

The CCR defines a transformation facility as "a facility whose principal function is to convert, combust, or otherwise process solid waste by incineration, pyrololysis, destructive distillation, or gasification, or to chemically or biologically process solid wastes, for the purpose of volume reduction, synthetic fuel production, or energy recovery. A transformation facility does not include a composting facility." (CCR Title 14, Chapter 9, Article 3, Section 18720(a)(77))

II. USE OF THE SITING CRITERIA

The siting criteria presented here for the planning and evaluation of proposed sites for solid waste land disposal and transformation facilities have broad applicability in the siting process. For each phase of the siting process (i.e., site selection, site evaluation, site permitting, and facility permitting), the siting criteria can be applied either directly or indirectly during the decision making processes. The use of a standard set of siting criteria can add predictability to the siting process for all participants by providing uniformity in the planning and evaluation of proposed facilities. The siting criteria provide the proponent, the regulator, and the community with a rational set of factors on which to judge the attributes (both positive and negative) of a proposed facility.

In the site selection phase, the siting criteria provide the facility developer with a set of guidelines and constraints to be used to screen potential sites for facilities. If the facility developer knows at the outset that the regulators will be evaluating the proposed sites with the same set of criteria, the facility developer is less likely to propose a site that will be unacceptable in terms of the criteria. The developer can determine the best site location with respect to achieving the criteria and eliminate locations that are deficient with respect to one or more crucial siting factors, especially those where mitigation measures would be limited, costly, or not feasible. The criteria also provide the facility developer with incentives to blend the proposed facility into existing and future land use patterns. In addition, the siting criteria were

developed within the realm of current solid waste and environmental regulations applicable to facility siting, and by meeting the criteria the proposed facility will likely have fewer problems to be worked out in the permitting phase of the siting process.

In the site evaluation phase, the siting criteria provide the local land use planner and others with review responsibility, and with a uniform set of criteria for evaluating all proposals. In essence, the criteria act as a template against which all facility proposals can be compared. The criteria will identify pertinent issues which will need to be specifically addressed in the evaluation of the site and in the environmental impact assessment, particularly with regard to the adequacy of proposed mitigation and the need for additional mitigation. The criteria can also be used as a checklist to determine which issues are likely to be of concern and should be focused on in the public debate over the siting of the facility.

In the site permitting phase, the siting criteria provide the decision-maker with a uniform set of factors on which to base judgments. If the proponent, decision-maker, and the public all view the proposed facility in the same context (i.e., through a uniform set of criteria) then the decisions on the facility will be based on the attributes of the facility and not on emotionalism or arbitrary judgment. By building a rational decision-making process into the facility siting process, facility developers and decision-makers can work with each other rather than against each other.

In the facility permitting process, the regulators will evaluate the facility with respect to established performance criteria (i.e., current regulations). As these are incorporated into the siting criteria, the use of the siting criteria by the facility developer will allow the facility developer to incorporate the performance criteria into his site selection and facility design decisions.

The siting criteria are applicable to both informal and formal review and evaluation processes. The selection of a site will likely involve an informal use of the criteria (e.g., preliminary decisions based on visual siting or secondary information), whereas the site evaluation and permitting components will require formal review and evaluation processes in the form of technical studies and preparation of environmental impact analyses. But whether the criteria are applied formally or informally, the siting criteria provide an uniform set of constraints, standards, and guidelines to be used in evaluating proposed facilities within a rational decision-making process.

OBJECTIVES:

PROTECT THE RESIDENTS

FACTORS:

Proximity to Populations

PROXIMITY TO POPULATIONS

Definition:

Proximity to populations is defined as the distance from the active portion of the facility to one or more dwellings used by one or more persons as a permanent place of residence, or to structures inhabited by persons temporarily for purposes of work other than daily activity.

Significance:

Solid waste land disposal/transformation facilities should be located such that the health, safety, and quality of life of nearby residents and other persons are not jeopardized from planned or fugitive air emissions, odors, vectors, fires, noise from facility operations, subsurface migration of potentially harmful substances, and other possible impacts.

A host community should consider requiring either a buffer distance or natural or engineered barriers, such as berms, buildings, trees, fences, etc., between solid waste land disposal/transformation facilities and residences.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities

Facility must be in conformance with local land use and zoning requirements of a county or city planning agency.

The County of Los Angeles prohibits construction of buildings or structures on or within 1,000 feet of a land disposal facility which contains decomposable materials/waste unless the facility is isolated by an approved natural or manmade protective system. The cities may have similar restrictions.

Transformation Facilities

These facilities should be located where the zoning and existing land use are compatible with the proposed use. For example, an abandoned chemical plant site in an industrial district could be considered to be a compatible land use for a transformation facility.

ENSURE THE STRUCTURAL STABILITY OF THE FACILITY

OBJECTIVE: ENSURE THE STRUCTURAL STABILITY AND SAFETY OF THE FACILITY

FACTORS:

- Flood hazard areas
- O Areas subject to tsunamis, seiches, and storm surges
- O Proximity to active or potentially active faults
- Slope stability
- Subsidence/Liquefaction
- O Dam failure inundation areas

FLOOD HAZARD AREAS

Definition:

Flood hazard areas are defined as areas which are prone to inundation by floods having a 100-year return period, and debris flows resulting from major storm events. These areas can be determined by checking the Federal Emergency Management Agency flood insurance maps or with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works.

Significance:

Inundation of a solid waste land disposal/transformation facility by flood waters, debris and/or flash flooding may lead to the physical transport of wastes, possibly impacting water quality and water-dependent species. In addition, flooding interrupts the operation of the facility and could stress leachate handling systems of a land disposal facility.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Disposal facilities must comply with requirements of the Federal Clean Water Act, as amended, and local Stormwater/Urban Runoff requirements.

Land Disposal Facilities:

Federal and State regulations require new, existing and expansions of existing Class III landfills to be designed, constructed, operated and maintained to prevent inundation or washout due to floods with a 100-year return period. In addition, the landfill must not reduce the flow of a 100-year flood or reduce the temporary storage capacity of the floodplain.

AREAS SUBJECT TO TSUNAMIS, SEICHES, AND STORM SURGES

Definition:

Areas subject to tsunamis, seiches, and storm surges are defined as areas bordering oceans, bays, inlets, estuaries or similar bodies of water which may flood due to tsunamis (commonly known as tidal waves), seiches (vertically oscillating standing waves usually occurring in enclosed bodies of water such as lakes, reservoirs, and harbors caused by seismic activity, violent winds, or changes in atmospheric pressure), or storm surges.

Significance:

Inundation of a facility by flood waters may lead to the physical transport of waste, possibly impacting water quality and water-dependent species. In addition, flooding interrupts the operation of the facility and could stress the leachate handling system of a land disposal facility.

Areas subject to tsunamis, seiches, and storm surges include the coastal areas of Los Angeles County. Inland lakes and reservoirs could be subject to seiching and storm surges. Coastal development is heavily restricted by Federal and State regulations, including the California Coastal Act of 1976.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Disposal facilities should avoid locating in areas subject to tsunamis, seiches, and storm surges unless designed, constructed, operated, and maintained to preclude failure due to such events.

PROXIMITY TO ACTIVE OR POTENTIALLY ACTIVE FAULTS

Definition:

An active fault is defined as a fault along which surface displacement has occurred during Holocene time (about the last 11,000 years) and is associated with one or more of the following:

- A recorded earthquake with surface rupture
- Fault creep slippage
- Displaced survey lines

A potentially active fault is defined as a fault showing evidence of surface displacement during Quaternary time (from the last 11,000 years to about the last 2 to 3 million years) and characterized by the following:

- Considerable length, e.g., over 30 miles
- Association with an alignment of numerous earthquake epicenters
- Continuity with faults having historic displacement
- Association with youthful major mountain scarps or ranges
- Correlation with strong geophysical anomalies

Significance:

The stability of a facility, a major concern for permanent facilities, is related to the potential for movement of the earth along fault zones.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

All facilities are to be designed and constructed in accordance with the local building code.

Class III Land Disposal Facilities:

Federal and State regulations prohibit the locating a new Class III landfill or a lateral expansion of an existing Class III landfill on a known Holocene Fault.

SLOPE STABILITY

Definition:

Slope stability is defined as the relative degree to which the site will be vulnerable to the forces of gravity, such as erosion, landslide, soil creep, earth flow or any other mass movement of earth material which might cause a breach or carry wastes away from a facility, or inundate the facility.

Significance:

The long-term containment of solid wastes at a site requires that the site be located in a geomorphic environment which does not encourage long-term instability by the processes of landslides and mass movement.

The State of California prohibits the locating of new Class III landfills within areas of potential rapid geological change, including landslides and mass movement, unless containment structures are designed, constructed, and maintained to preclude failure.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities located within these areas should have engineered design safety features to assure structural stability.

SUBSIDENCE/LIQUEFACTION

Definition:

Subsidence is defined as a sinking of the land surface following the removal of solid mineral matter or fluids (water or oil) from the rock beneath. Liquefaction refers to surface materials that develop liquid properties upon being physically disturbed.

Significance:

Subsidence of the land may weaken the structural integrity of a facility. Liquefaction can quickly convert soil materials to fluid masses, resulting in the lateral spreading and subsidence of surface materials, and threatening the structural integrity of the facility.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Avoid locating in areas determined to have a high potential for failure due to subsidence or liquefaction unless containment structures are designed, constructed, and maintained to preclude failure as a result of such change.

DAM FAILURE INUNDATION AREAS

Definition:

Dam failure inundation areas are defined as areas immediately adjacent to a river or stream below an embankment or masonry dam which would be inundated by the flow of water from the impoundment created by the dam if the dam were to fail.

Significance:

Failures of large U.S. dams in the past 35 years illustrate the potential destruction to natural and manmade features in the danger reach. Dam impoundments have the potential to create a flood hazard which would have the same or worse effects as this associated with flood hazard areas.

Dam owners in California are required by the State Office of Emergency Services to prepare and submit dam failure inundation maps to local jurisdictions for use on local land use planning activities.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities should be located outside dam failure inundation areas.

PROTECT SURFACE WATER

OBJECTIVE: PROTECT SURFACE WATER

FACTORS:

• Aqueducts and reservoirs

O Discharge of treated effluent

AQUEDUCTS AND RESERVOIRS

Definition:

Aqueducts are defined as conduits for conveying drinking water supplies. Reservoirs are defined as impoundments for containing drinking water

supplies with minimal natural drainage areas.

Significance:

Run-off or drainage from a facility could possibly enter aqueducts or

reservoirs depending upon a number of factors.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Disposal facilities must comply with requirements of the Federal Clean Water

Act, as amended, and local Stormwater/Urban Runoff requirements.

Class III Land Disposal Facilities:

Federal and State regulations require new and existing Class III landfills to fitted with subsurface barriers, as well, as precipitation and drainage control

facilities.

DISCHARGE OF TREATED EFFLUENT

Definition:

Discharge of treated effluent is defined as the availability of wastewater treatment facilities to accept wastewater (effluent), or the ability to discharge treated effluent, when permitted, directly into a stream, including a dry stream bed, or into the ocean through a State-permitted outfall.

Significance:

Some facilities will generate a treated effluent requiring discharge to receiving waters. Facilities could discharge to sanitary sewers, with the appropriate regulatory agency requiring adequate pretreatment of wastewaters to a specified level before discharge.

Criteria:

Facilities Generating Wastewaters:

Facilities should be located in areas with adequate sewer capacity to accommodate the expected wastewater discharge. If sewers are not available, on-site treatment should be considered. Alternately, wastewaters could also be transported in bulk via highways to facilities capable of treating them.

Facilities discharging into streams or into the ocean, directly or via storm drains, will require National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits issued by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. The NPDES permit sets limitations on the quantity and quality of the waste discharges, and may specify engineering and technical requirements to ensure compliance.

PROTECT GROUNDWATER

OBJECTIVE: PROTECT GROUNDWATER

FACTORS:

- o Proximity to supply wells and well fields
- O Depth to groundwater
- Groundwater monitoring
- O Major aquifer recharge areas
- Permeability of surficial materials
- Existing groundwater quality

PROXIMITY TO SUPPLY WELLS AND WELL FIELDS

Definition:

Proximity to supply wells and well fields is defined as the distance to areas used for extraction of groundwater drinking water supplies by high capacity production wells as identified by the presence of several wells that constitute a well field.

Significance:

Areas that are immediately adjacent to wells and well fields may be extremely susceptible to contamination due to increased gradients and velocities caused by extraction of large volumes of water. An increased risk is associated with locating land disposal facilities in near proximity to existing production wells due to the potential danger of contaminating water.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

Facilities must meet the State of California's geologic setting criteria for ensuring no impairment of beneficial uses of surface water or of groundwater beneath or adjacent to the landfill.

DEPTH TO GROUNDWATER

Definition:

Depth to groundwater is defined as the minimum seasonal depth to the highest anticipated elevation of underlying groundwater from the bottom of any proposed waste containing facility.

Significance:

If the water table arises above the bottom of a facility, it may breach the facility liner or foundation and come into direct contact with the waste, causing groundwater contamination to occur.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

For Class III landfills, all containment structures must be capable of withstanding hydraulic pressure gradients to prevent failure due to settlement, compression or uplift as certified by a registered civil engineer or engineering geologist registered in California.

Federal and State regulations require new and expansions of existing Class III landfills to be fitted with containment structures that meet specified permeability standards. In addition, the facility must be fitted with a groundwater collection system and a leachate collection and removal systems.

Furthermore, facilities must meet the State of California's minimum requirements for ensuring no impairment of beneficial use of surface water or of groundwater beneath or adjacent to the landfill, which also includes location restrictions.

GROUNDWATER MONITORING RELIABILITY

Definition:

Groundwater monitoring reliability is the reliability of a scientifically designed monitoring program to measure, observe, and evaluate groundwater quality and flow.

Significance:

A reliable groundwater monitoring system around a facility is required to provide an early warning detection system for possible contaminant migration within the facility property boundaries. Corrective measures and remedial action are more effective and less expensive if initiated during the early stages of any contaminant migration.

To assure that groundwater is reliably monitored, a facility should be located where the following can be characterized, modeled, and analyzed with a relatively high degree of confidence:

- Subsurface geology
- Hydrologic characteristics
- Direction and magnitude of groundwater flow

This implies that the site should be geologically and hydrologically uniform.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

Facilities must comply with the California Regional Water Quality Control Board permit requirements for groundwater monitoring.

MAJOR AQUIFER RECHARGE AREAS

Definition:

Major aquifer recharge areas are defined as regions of principal recharge to major regional aquifers, as identified in the existing literature or by hydrogeologic experts familiar with Southern California. Such recharge areas are typically found in:

- Outcrop or subcrop areas of major water-yielding facies of confined aquifers.
- Outcrop or subcrop areas of confining units which supply major recharge to underlying regional aquifers.

Significance:

Aquifers receive their principal water supplies from areas which allow water infiltrating from the land surface to rapidly recharge the aquifer.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

Facilities must meet the State of California's minimum requirements for ensuring no impairment of beneficial use of surface water or of groundwater beneath or adjacent to the landfill, which also includes location restrictions.

PERMEABILITY OF SURFICIAL MATERIALS

Definition:

Permeability of surficial materials is defined as the ability of geologic materials at the earth's surface to infiltrate and percolate water.

Significance:

The surficial materials overlying major water bearing formations in an area provides a pathway for vertical migration of potential contaminants. Permeable geologic materials can allow rapid movement of pollutants into major regional aquifers. Thick deposits of fine-grained materials of low hydraulic conductivity retard the rate of vertical percolation of pollutants to the groundwater, and provide an opportunity for detection and control of pollutant releases before it contaminates aquifers. Materials having a low permeability tend also to have favorable attenuation characteristics for individual contaminants.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

Federal and State regulations require new and lateral expansions of existing Class III landfill facilities to be underlain by a composite liner, consisting of a lower clay liner and an upper synthetic membrane, and which is of sufficient thickness to prevent vertical movement of fluids including waste and leachate. The lower component of which shall consist of a minimum of two feet of compacted soil/clay with a hydraulic conductivity of no more than 1×10^{-7} cm/sec.

Facilities must meet the State of California's minimum requirements for ensuring no impairment of beneficial use of surface water or of groundwater beneath or adjacent to the landfill, which also includes location restrictions.

EXISTING GROUNDWATER QUALITY

Definition:

Existing groundwater quality is defined as the chemical quality of the groundwater in comparison to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Interim, Primary, and Secondary Drinking Water Standards; and, for constituents with no standards-to-follow guidelines suggested by research and reported in literature.

Significance:

The significance of the potential impact of a facility on groundwater quality is related to the actual potential use of the groundwater. The EPA has released guidelines defining protection policies for three classes of groundwater, based on their respective value and their vulnerability to contamination. The three classes are:

- <u>Class I</u>: Groundwater that is highly vulnerable to contamination and characterized by being irreplaceable or ecologically vital. These are designated as Special Groundwaters.
- <u>Class II</u>: Current or potential sources of drinking waters having other beneficial uses.
- <u>Class III</u>: Groundwaters not considered potential sources of drinking water and of limited beneficial use or otherwise contaminated beyond levels that allow cleanup using reasonably employed treatment methods.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

Facilities must meet the California Regional Water Quality Control Board's minimum water quality protection standards and criteria in order to ensure no impairment of the beneficial uses of groundwater beneath or adjacent to the landfill.

PROTECT AIR QUALITY

OBJECTIVE: PROTECT AIR QUALITY

FACTORS:

o PSD areas

o Nonattainment areas

o Landfill surface emissions

PSD AREAS

Definition:

Prevention of significant deterioration (PSD) areas are defined as areas in attainment of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for one or more criteria pollutants. PSD areas are divided into three classes. Class I includes international parks, national wilderness areas exceeding 5,000 acres, national memorial parks exceeding 5,000 acres, and other areas approved by the EPA Administrator. All other areas are classified as Class II.

Significance:

The prevention of significant deterioration of high quality airsheds is mandatory under the Clean Air Amendments of 1990. Any new source meeting the statutory definition of either a new major source or a modification to a major source locating in a PSD area must meet stringent conditions, including the installation of Best Available Control Technology (BACT), before initial construction or major modifications are allowed. Sources required to submit to PSD preconstruction review are:

- A new source or modification to an existing source where the increase in potential to emit is either 25 or 40 tons per year, depending on source category
- A significant emission increase of an attainment pollutant at an existing major stationary source,
- A net emission increase at a major stationary source located within 10 kilometers of a Class I PSD area, if the emission increase would impact the Class I area by 1.0 μg/m³ (24-hour average).

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), through the authority of the State Air Resources Board, is managing the PSD program in the South Coast Air Basin. The District's PSD regulations require BACT for all stationary sources with a net emission increase of a criteria pollutant.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities locating in regions which are classified under PSD regulation as major stationary sources will be required to submit to preconstruction review and apply BACT. All facilities locating in the South Coast Air Basin will be required to apply BACT for any net emission increase of an attainment criteria air pollutant.

NONATTAINMENT AREAS

Definition:

Nonattainment areas are defined as areas in which the level of one or more of the criteria pollutants (total suspended particulates, ozone, oxides of sulfur and nitrogen, and carbon monoxide) exceed the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

Significance:

Federal law requires states to implement air pollution control programs to improve or preserve existing air quality in accordance with the NAAQS. Facilities, particularly incinerators, will emit pollutants in quantities which may exceed allowable limits.

The South Coast Air Basin is nonattainment for ozone, particulates, carbon monoxide, and nitrogen dioxide. Facilities emitting nonattainment air contaminants will be subject to New Source Review requirements including application of BACT or Lowest Achievable Emission Rate (LAER). Net cumulative emission increase exceeding certain threshold limits will require the obtaining of offsets to balance the increased pollutant levels.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities with air emissions locating in non-attainment areas and emitting air contaminants in excess of established limits will require preconstruction review under New Source Review requirements, and the obtaining of a Permit to Construct and a Permit to Operate from the SCAQMD. Air pollution control requirements vary by type of facility and are specified by SCAQMD.

Transformation Facilities:

In addition, the SCAQMD is required under Section 42315 of the State Health and Safety Code (H&SC) to perform a health risk assessment and make a determination that no significant increase in illness or mortality is anticipated by a project before issuing or renewing a permit to construct or operate.

EMISSIONS FROM CLASS III LANDFILLS

Definition:

Landfill gases can be generated as a result of organic waste decomposition process. These gases generally consist of methane, carbon dioxide, with small quantities of hydrogen sulfide and carbon chain substances.

Significance:

Methane gas, produced from the decomposition of organic materials, can be emitted from Class III land disposal facilities without a landfill gas control system.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

Class III land disposal facilities are subject to the SCAQMD rules and regulations. All existing and proposed Class III land disposal facilities must comply with the SCAQMD Rule 1150.1 "Control of Gaseous Emissions from Active Landfills." The Rule requires installation of a landfill gas control system and perimeter monitoring probes, as well as, implementation of a monitoring program to ensure that landfill gas emissions do not exceed specified SCAQMD standards.

PROTECTION OF ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE AREAS

OBJECTIVE: PROTECTION OF ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE AREAS

FACTORS:

- Wetlands
- Proximity to habitats of threatened and endangered species
- o Agricultural lands
- Natural, recreational, cultural, and aesthetic resources
- O Significant ecological areas

WETLANDS

Definition:

Wetlands are defined as areas, such as saltwater, freshwater, and brackish swamps, marshes, or bogs inundated by surface or groundwater with a frequency to support, under normal circumstances, a prevalence of vegetative or aquatic life that requires saturated or seasonally saturated soil conditions for growth and reproduction.

Significance:

The preservation of wetlands area is critical to preserve a balanced ecosystem. The location of a land disposal facility in a wetlands area could result in the loss of critical habitats, loss of the wetlands for groundwater recharge, and an increase in the potential for pollutant dispersal in ground and surface waters.

Wetlands areas are located primarily along the coast and near embayments and estuaries. Development in coastal areas, and wetlands areas in particular, is restricted by Federal and State regulations, including the California Coastal Act of 1976.

Criteria:

Transformation Facilities:

Facilities should avoid locating in current wetlands areas, as defined in adopted general, regional, and State plans, unless: a) industrial usage is permitted by the local government's land use planning or zoning, and b) fish, plant, and wildlife resources can be maintained and enhanced in a portion of the site, or preserved elsewhere in the area.

Land disposal facilities:

Facilities should be located outside wetlands areas, as defined in adopted general, regional, and State plans.

PROXIMITY TO HABITATS OF THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES

Definition:

Habitats of threatened and endangered species are defined as areas known to be inhabited permanently or seasonally or known to be critical at any stage in the life cycle of any species of wildlife or vegetation identified or being considered for identification as "endangered" or "threatened" by the U.S. Department of Interior or the State of California.

Significance:

Threatened and endangered species are important as biological resources because of the irreversibility of species extinction.

The loss of such species would seriously interfere with the health of the ecosystem and deter human education and research.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

A facility should not locate in habitats of threatened or endangered species unless the local land use authority makes a determination that a proposed facility is compatible with the surrounding resources and does not pose a substantial threat to the resource.

AGRICULTURAL LANDS

Definition:

Agricultural lands are lands zoned countywide and/or used locally for

agricultural use.

Significance:

Farmlands and other agricultural lands are natural and economic resources

essential for food production. These lands serve both private and public

interests in terms of food, jobs, and open space preservation.

Criteria:

Land Disposal Facilities:

A facility located in areas zoned for agricultural uses must obtain a local land

use permit from the local jurisdiction.

NATURAL, RECREATIONAL, CULTURAL, AND AESTHETIC RESOURCES

Definition:

Natural, recreational, cultural, and aesthetic resources are defined as public and private lands having local, regional, state, or national significance, value, or importance. These lands include national, state, regional, county, and local parks and recreation areas, historic and prehistoric resources, wild and scenic rivers, scenic highways, and public and private preservation areas.

Significance:

Facilities sited in these areas could adversely impact the natural, recreational,

cultural, or aesthetic value of the lands.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities should avoid locating in these areas unless the applicant can demonstrate that a facility is compatible with the land use in the area.

SIGNIFICANT ECOLOGICAL AREAS

Definition:

Significant ecological areas are defined as areas which possess biotic resources that are uncommon, rare, unique, or critical to the maintenance of wildlife on a Federal, State, or Countywide basis.

Significance:

The preservation of significant ecological areas is critical for the protection and preservation of biological resources or for maintaining natural ecosystems.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Location of a proposed facility must be in conformance with a local jurisdiction's General Plan and abide by Federal and State regulations regarding unique or protected species and their habitat.

ENSURE SAFE TRANSPORTATION OF SOLID WASTE

OBJECTIVE: ENSURE SAFE TRANSPORTATION OF SOLID WASTE

FACTORS:

- o Proximity to areas of waste generation
- O Distance from major route
- Structures and properties fronting minor routes
- O Highway accident rate
- o Capacity vs. Average Annual Daily Traffic of access roads

PROXIMITY TO AREAS OF WASTE GENERATION

Definition:

Proximity to areas of waste generation is defined as travel time from the wasteshed areas to the proposed facility.

Significance:

The greater the distance between a wasteshed area and a proposed facility will result in the increase of transportation costs; emission of air pollutants; and risk in vehicle accidents.

Generators also benefit from shorter travel requirements. Transportation costs can have a marked impact on waste management costs. High transportation costs could possibly induce some generators to use unsafe disposal practices.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities should be centrally located near wasteshed areas to minimize potential impacts associated with greater travel distances.

Alternate transportation, by rail, may be evaluated in regard to specific sites to be located at distant areas from the wasteshed.

DISTANCE FROM MAJOR ROUTE

Definition:

Distance from a major route is defined as the distance along a minor route (city street, boulevard, or undivided highway) that a truck must travel to reach the facility after leaving the major route (street or interstate divided highway).

Significance:

Public concern over a hauler's route is heightened when transportation occurs over roads not constructed for heavy truck traffic, not intended for it, or containing many restrictions such as traffic lights or horizontal and vertical curves. The distance on minor routes should be kept to a minimum to avoid interference with commercial or residential traffic and reduce the risks of accidents.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Distance traveled on minor roads should be kept to a minimum. Facilities are best located near an exit of a major route or accessed from major routes via routes used locally for truck traffic.

Alternately, local roads could be upgraded by increasing their load capacity, improving traffic controls or building truck-only lanes or routes. The facility developer may build a direct access road to avoid the minor route(s).

STRUCTURES AND PROPERTIES FRONTING MINOR ROUTES

Definition:

Structures fronting minor routes are defined by the number and type of residences, schools, hospitals, and shopping centers having primary access from the transportation route between the entrance of a facility and the nearest major route.

Significance:

A great increase in truck traffic, particularly on roads used primarily by cars, may cause considerable noise, congestion, and disruption of normal daily activities.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

Facilities should be located such that any minor routes from the major route to the facility are used primarily by trucks, and the number of nonindustrial structures (homes, hospitals, schools, etc.) is minimal.

HIGHWAY ACCIDENT RATE

Definition:

The highway accident rate is defined as the occurrence of minor to fatal accidents per vehicle miles traveled, as recorded by the California Department of Transportation.

Significance:

Accident rates vary significantly by type of road and average annual daily traffic (AADT). Accident rates should, however, be analyzed in conjunction with information about the percentage of truck usage and the design of the road. The accident rate alone should not be used to judge the safety of the highway.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

The minimum time path from major wasteshed areas to a facility should follow highways with low to moderate average annual daily traffic and accident rates as guided by the research and findings of state, regional, county, and city transportation planners.

CAPACITY VERSUS AVERAGE ANNUAL DAILY TRAFFIC OF ACCESS ROADS

Definition:

Capacity versus average annual daily traffic (AADT) of access roads is defined as the number of vehicles the road is designed to handle versus the number of vehicles it does handle on a daily basis, averaged over a period of one year.

Significance:

Roads currently handling at or near the maximum number of vehicles should not be considered good routes for the transport of solid waste. Ideally, the roads best suited for solid waste transportation are those on which the additionally vehicles serving the facility will have little or no impact on the average annual daily traffic relative to the capacity.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

The changes in the ratio capacity to AADT should be negligible after calculating the number of trucks on the major and minor routes expected to service the facility.

PROTECT THE SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GOALS OF THE COMMUNITY

OBJECTIVE: PROTECT THE SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GOALS OF THE COMMUNITY

FACTORS:

Consistency with General Plan

CONSISTENCY WITH GENERAL PLAN

Definition:

Consistency with the General Plan is defined as consistency of the proposed facility with the long-term goals of the county or city as expressed by its local planning instruments: the General Plan and implementing ordinances.

Significance:

"Local Planning" is an ongoing process of directing growth and development in accordance with previously formulated plans, policy documents, ordinances, and actions.

The State of California requires by law that counties and cities develop a General Plan and implementing ordinances. The Los Angeles County General Plan sets forth policies for the unincorporated areas in the County. This plan was coordinated with the cities in the County and basically reflects the planning efforts of these cities.

A General Plan contains policy statements and guidelines reflecting the County's or city's outlook on future growth and development.

Zoning ordinances are used as a principal means of implementing the General Plan. Each zone represents a special application of land use regulations and guidelines. This zoning, as required by State law, must be consistent with the adopted General Plan.

Consistency between the facility and local planning is necessary to ensure that the facility development will not interfere with the achievement of city or County goals. Preferred sites are usually those that are away from residential areas and are well-served by utilities.

Criteria:

All Facilities:

The proposed facility must be consistent with the county or city General Plan. However, the applicant may petition for an amendment to the General Plan. In addition, the proposed facility must be found to be in conformance with the Countywide Siting Element of the County of Los Angeles. This is accomplished by obtaining a valid Finding of Conformance granted by the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force.



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PRELIMINARY ALTERNATE SITE STUDY

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

This report is based on an alternate site study cooperatively conducted by the staffs of the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, the County Chief Administrative Office, and the County Sanitation Districts Solid Waste Management Department in response to a request by the County Board of Supervisors (Board Order No. 150) to identify "the five best landfill sites currently not being used in the County, two potential refuse-to-energy sites, and two sites for refuse transfer stations". A preliminary study was initiated to analyze potential sites for these facilities throughout the County. Distant or remote sites (e.g. desert areas) not in proximity to metropolitan Los Angeles County were not considered for landfilling.

While the identification process for the "best" new landfill sites is an important step towards a countywide solid waste management solution to the impending disposal crisis (i.e. the time when, due to landfill closures, permit limitations, and operational constraints on remaining sites, a portion of the daily wastestream will not have a disposal location in the County), it should be noted that expansions and repermitting of existing disposal facilities affords the most timely and cost efficient first step towards the ultimate solution. Existing access, traffic patterns, and on site operations at these facilities lessens the implementation and mitigation costs relative to new sites. The potential exists for expansion and repermitting of several existing landfill sites within metropolitan Los Angeles County. These include Puente Hills Landfill (70 million tons of expansion capacity), Scholl Canyon (6 million tons of expansion capacity), Azusa Western (3 million tons of expansion capacity), Bradley West (repermitting of 15 million tons of capacity remaining at the time of LUP expiration), North Valley (215 million tons of expansion capacity), and Chiquita Canyon (21 million tons of expansion capacity).

II. IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL LANDFILL SITES


A three phase approach which considered a complex set of technical, environmental and social factors was utilized to analyze 101 potential landfill sites within metropolitan Los Angeles County. The first phase involved the determination of the alternate site study area. The second phase consisted of identifying candidate sites by means of a screening process. The third phase involved a numerical rating of the candidate sites.

A. Determination of Alternate Sites Study Area

Unlike typical siting studies which consider locations of existing landfill sites in determining new site feasibility (due to relative haul distances and landfill closures which could affect the resulting disposal cost), this study considered all areas within metropolitan Los Angeles County to be feasible. For the purpose of this siting effort, the study area was therefore limited to portions of Los Angeles County south of both the Santa Clara River and the San Gabriel Mountains (see Figure 1).

B. Alternate Site Screening Process

A screening process was used to determine potential alternative sites. Acrial photographs of the county were reviewed in order to find open space areas that might serve as potential landfill sites. In the initial screening process, one parameter used to focus the screening process was geological suitability for Class III landfills. Based on existing geologic information, the geologically suitable areas are located principally in mountain areas, such as the Santa Monica Mountains, Verdugo Hills, Santa Susana Mountains, Puente Hills and the San Gabriel Mountain Foothills. Data based on reconnaissance geologic surveys by the State Department of Water Resources were utilized to perform the screening. While detailed field surveys of individual sites would be necessary to determine the specific geology, this procedure provided a straightforward method of determining Class III geologic potential.



ALTERNATE SITE STUDY AREA

During the initial screening process a premium was placed on canyon sites possessing underlying geology with low permeability due to the natural protection afforded for prevention of groundwater contamination. Potential sites in sand and gravel pits which do not possess this natural protection were eliminated during the initial screening process.

In addition to geology, certain existing uses were also considered as initial screening parameters to eliminate sites from further consideration. Uses such as a site-centered public street, on-site reservoir, and housing directly within potential fill areas were regarded as disqualifying features. Thirty-eight (38) of the original 101 sites investigated passed the initial screening and are listed in Table 1. Locations of these sites are indicated in Figure 2.

The second step in the screening process involved a more detailed evaluation of the sites passing the initial screening. An extensive set of criteria was used in the evaluation of each site. The criteria are divided into three categories: 1) Service - criteria having to do with the ability of the site to meet regional solid waste management objectives; 2) Urban Uses - criteria related to landfill impacts on local land use; and 3) Conservation - criteria related to preservation of the natural land and the conservation of resources. Table 2 presents the full list of evaluation criteria with a short definition of each criterion.

Each of the sites passing the initial screening was evaluated against the criteria to determine if a "critical deficiency" was present which would eliminate the site from further consideration. A critical deficiency occurred when the site was unable to satisfy one or more of the evaluation criteria and the deficiency could not be practically corrected. Of the 38 sites passing the initial screening, critical deficiencies were found in 28 sites in the areas of Service and Urban Uses. For the purpose of this preliminary study, no sites were assessed critical deficiencies based

ALTERNATE SITE EVALUATION CRITERIA

SERVICE (Disposal Operations Service Criteria)

- 1. Acquirability Time to acquire and cost of acquisition.
- 2. Haul time Typical time to haul to the site by collection vehicles.
- 3. Geology Geologic formations and seismicity with respect to containment and drainage; availability of off-site storm drains.
- 4. Access Off highway haul route, considering length, width, grade and construction required.
- 5. Capacity and cover Volume available for disposal; adequate area for operations; sufficient cover soil.
- 6. Preparation Preparation required prior to disposal, considering grading, barriers, berms and water supply.
- 7. Energy use By collection vehicles and associated disposal operations.

URBAN USES (Adjacent Urban Uses Criteria)

- 8. Isolation From homes, schools, churches and the like.
- 9. Neighborhood Compatibility with zoning, planning and adjacent property.
- 10. Mitigatibility Of adverse impacts (odor, methane gas, view disturbance, noise, vectors, dust) on adjacent urban uses.
- 11. Traffic Impact of disposal operations on traffic flow along streets and freeways in the area.
- 12. Uses displaced Number and community value of any improvements on the site that landfilling would eliminate.

CONSERVATION (Conservation and End Use Criteria)

- 13. Restorability Amenability of site to restoration for end use; preserving, restoring and/or buffering habitat, wildlife corridors, watershed and viewshed.
- 14. Ecology Compatibility of natural values in the area in its present state with landfilling, considering existing disturbance.
- 15. Recreation Compatibility of outdoor recreation on the site, and in the region including the site, with landfilling --considering any difficulty of development for recreation that landfilling may create or remove.
- 16. Open Space Plans Degree of compatibility with regulations and plans designed to preserve open space.
- 17. Materials Recovery Character and location of site with regard to supporting materials recovery from waste.
- 18. Energy Extraction Character and location of site with regard to supporting energy recovery from waste.
- 19. Air Quality Pollution from collection vehicles and on-site equipment.
- 20. Anti-litter Character and location of site with regard to reducing littering and indiscriminate dumping.

on Conservation criteria (e.g. within a significant ecological area as defined by the County of Los Angeles General Plan, 1980). Only detailed environmental assessments can substantiate a determination as to whether there are overriding considerations for utilizing such sites for sanitary landfilling. The remaining 10 sites are listed in Table 3. Locations for these potential sites are indicated in Figure 3.

C. Rating of Alternative Sites

The third phase of the analysis involved a process of numerically rating the alternate sites which were not judged to have critical deficiencies. Each evaluation criterion was given a weight which indicated the relative importance of the criterion in the rating process. The median weights and standard deviations for each criterion are listed in Table 4. Overall, the weighting is balanced in the relative importance attached to the three general categories of criteria: service, urban uses, and conservation.


The rating evaluation of the alternative sites was performed by assigning scores of one to five for each of the rating criteria and multiplying by the criteria weights previously discussed to obtain numerical ratings for each of the criteria. These criteria ratings were summed to determine each site's composite rating. The ratings were then ranked from highest composite score to lowest. While the object of this study is to identify the five highest ranking potential landfill sites (as per the Board's request), the results of the rating evaluation did not allow the staff to assuredly distinguish between the two sites ranked fifth and sixth. However, the rankings do indicate a distinct grouping of the potential sites such that six specific sites are considerably higher ranked than the remaining four. Given the preliminary nature of this siting study, the staff believes all of the six highest ranked sites should be subjected to more detailed feasibility and environmental studies. These six sites are listed in alphabetical order in Table 5. Figure 4 indicates locations of



SIX "BEST" POTENTIAL LANDFILL SITES


the six identified sites as well as previously mentioned existing sites which have expansion capability.

III. IDENTIFICATION OF SITES FOR REFUSE-TO-ENERGY FACILITIES

There have been numerous sites proposed for the construction of refuse-to-energy facilities in Los Angeles County over recent years. Figure 5 shows the locations of refuseto-energy facility sites that have been proposed since 1980. Of the 13 proposed sites, only two, the Commerce Facility and the Southeast Resource Recovery Facility (SERRF) have been implemented. Several specific refuse-to-energy projects - Irwindale, LANCER, and Spadra, had progressed well into the permitting process before being suspended due to vigorous public opposition. The City of Los Angeles abandoned the LANCER program, which was designed to ultimately process over 5,000 tons per day through three separate plants due to local opposition to the south central site. The 3,000 ton per day Irwindale Facility, for which Pacific Waste Management applied for a permit to the California Energy Commission, garnered significant political opposition throughout the San Gabriel Valley and the CEC terminated the permit process on this project in mid-1987. Finally, the 1,000 ton per day Spadra Refuse-to-Energy Facility air permit application was withdrawn at the direction of the Sanitation Districts' Board of Directors, not for technical reasons. but because the communities for which the project was designed to serve no longer supported the project. Because needed support for refuse-to-energy is lacking, further implementation of this technology in the near future in Los Angeles County is unlikely.

IV. IDENTIFICATION OF SITES FOR REFUSE TRANSFER STATIONS

It is most desirable to locate transfer stations in a central location for the potential users of the facilities in order to minimize the direct haul of refuse trucks from the end of the collection route to the transfer facility. In addition, transfer facilities should be sited in areas zoned for commercial/industrial uses with close access to major freeways.

Although new transfer stations would likely be fully enclosed and would be compatible with other commercial/industrial facilities, the volume of truck traffic necessary to support a transfer station is a primary siting consideration.

Locations of existing transfer stations are shown on Figure 6. Most of these are located in the South County area which does not have any remaining disposal sites. In general, transfer stations should offer the most economical transport options for areas located between a minimum of 25 to 50 miles away from a disposal site. Figure 6 also shows the 25 miles and 50 miles radii of an assumed wasteshed area with a centroid located in the central metropolitan area. From this assumed centroid, new disposal sites located beyond the 25 mile radius may justify consideration of new transfer stations. If substantial disposal capacity from expansions of existing sites is permitted in conjunction with at least several large capacity new disposal sites from the list of "six best" sites, then it is not clear at this time that there will be a need for new transfer stations. Consideration of new transfer stations would be more appropriate at such time that there is some certainty of the locations for new disposal sites to be utilized.

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TRANSFER STATIONS
