- Place tree/foliage at the curb next to your trash carts on your regular collection day, without blocking streets, alleys, or sidewalks.

Plastic trees/foliage are not recycled or accepted. Please call (888) 404-2278 to schedule a bulky item pickup for these items.

#### **Too Toxic to Trash**

The Los Angeles County Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste (HHW/E-Waste) Collection Program offers FREE and convenient ways to responsibly dispose of items that are too toxic and hazardous to go in the regular trash. If combined with regular trash, HHW and E-Waste items, such as lithium batteries, may cause fires and serious damage to the environment.

### Items collected at LA County HHW/E-Waste events and drop-off centers include:

- Unwanted electronic devices (TVs, microwaves, computers, etc.)
- Paint
- Car and household batteries
- Household cleaning products
- Used motor oil
- Sharps and pharmaceuticals
- Reusable 1 lb. propane tanks

## Pumpkin Food Waste on Halloween

Carving pumpkins is a huge part of our Halloween tradition. However, it is important to note that they play a huge role in Halloween-related food waste. To reduce the environmental impact of this tradition, please toss your pumpkins in your green organic waste cart. However, prior to doing so, be sure to first remove any paint, glitter, decorations, candles, or wax. If these items cannot be removed, pumpkins should go in your black trash cart.

## Frying a Turkey? Here are some helpful tips to gobble up first!

Fryer oil should never be poured down the drain. Oil and grease rinsed down household drains can clog pipes and cause backups. To properly dispose of cooking oil and grease, simply pour them into a sealable container after letting it cool down, then place the container in your regular household trash.



### Timing Is Everything: Don't Let Your Trash Carts Break the Rules

In accordance with Los Angeles County Code, trash carts may only be placed at the curb after 5 p.m. the day before pickup and must be removed by 8 p.m. on collection day, or within two hours after pickup, whichever is later.
