SUPPORT - SENATE BILL 240 (EGGMAN) AS AMENDED ON MARCH 10, 2021 - INCOME TAX: CREDITS: FOOD BANKS

The Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force (Task Force) **SUPPORTS** Senate Bill 240 (SB 240), as amended on March 10, 2021.

The proposed legislation, if enacted, would extend the sunset date for the existing Donated Fresh Fruit or Vegetables Credit for another five years until January 1, 2027, to allow qualified taxpayers to continue to receive a credit for their donation of qualified items to California food banks. Additionally, SB 240 extends the date for the Franchise Tax Board to submit an annual report on the utilization of the credit until January 1, 2026 and makes declarative findings to comply with the reporting requirements of the provisions of Revenue and Taxation Code Section 41. If enacted, SB 240 would also provide needed certainty to food donors and recipients by extending the authorization until January 1, 2027.

As provided by AB 939 (1989) and Chapter 3.67 of the Los Angeles County Code, the Task Force is responsible for coordinating the development of major solid waste planning documents for Los Angeles County and the 88 cities in the County with a population of over ten million. The Task Force addresses issues impacting the solid waste management system on a countywide basis.
