

# SENATE BILL 1383 REGULATIONS

LOS ANGELES COUNTY INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT TASK FORCE

**NOVEMBER 19, 2020** 



## Senate Bill 1383 (2016)

Requires California Air Resources Board to implement the short-lived climate pollutant strategy to reduce methane emissions by 40 percent

Requires CalRecycle to develop regulations to achieve the following organic waste landfill disposal reduction targets:

- 2020 50% reduction in statewide disposal of organic waste
- 2025 75% reduction in statewide disposal of organic waste
- 2025 20% of edible food that is currently disposed recovered for human consumption



### **Regulatory Requirements**

- Mandatory organic waste collection services
- Education and outreach
- Organic waste recycling capacity
- Procurement of recovered organic waste products
- Edible food recovery programs
- Monitoring and enforcement including mandatory minimum penalties of \$50-\$500 per violation
- Penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for local jurisdictions

#### **Timeline**

Jan. 2019 – CalRecycle released 1<sup>st</sup> formal draft regulations for 45-day comment period.

Jun. 2019 – CalRecycle released 2<sup>nd</sup> formal draft regulations for 30-day comment period.

Sep. 2019 – CalRecycle released 3<sup>rd</sup> formal draft for a 15-day public comment period.

Jan. 2020 – CalRecycle adopted the regulations and submitted them to OAL.

Mar. 2020 – The Office of Administrative Law (OAL) did not approve the regulations.

Apr. 2020 – CalRecycle released 4<sup>th</sup> formal draft for a 30-day public comment period.

Oct. 2020 – CalRecycle resubmitted the regulations to OAL.

Nov. 2020 – OAL approved the regulations.

Jan. 2022 – The regulations come into effect.

#### **Task Force Comments**

CalRecycle did not make significant edits in the final version of the regulations.

The Task Force's comments from the May 18, 2020 letter were not addressed, including:

- Lack of "good faith effort" provisions
- Overly prescriptive and inordinate requirements for local jurisdictions
- Mandatory monetary penalties for residents, businesses, and local government facilities
- Procurement requirements
- Conversion technologies
- Waivers
