Bi-monthly water bills help cover the costs of operations, repairs, and maintenance to keep water service reliable for Districts' customers.

Los Angeles County Public Works, on behalf of the Los Angeles County Waterworks Districts, provides services that ensure safe, clean, and reliable water to over 260,000 people in Kagel Canyon (Dist. 21), Malibu and Topanga (Dist.29), Val Verde (Dist. 36), Acton (Dist. 37), Antelope Valley (Dist. 40), and operates and maintains the water system in Marina del Rey.

We are making long-term investments to ensure that our water system is well maintained. It's been over a decade—and in some cases nearly two—since the last general rate increase for the Waterworks Districts.

To keep up with rising costs and maintain reliable service, Public Works is proposing a water rate increase beginning in 2026.
