

Goals for the Antelope Valley Integrated Regional Water Management Planning Process

The Antelope Valley Regional Planning Group¹ will:

1. Develop an Integrated Regional Water Management Plan for a planning period between 2005 and 2035 by December 31, 2007 that:
 - a. is endorsed by 30 stakeholder groups within our region
 - b. describes reasonably foreseeable range of total water demands for our region during the planning period
 - c. characterizes the available water supplies for our region during the planning period
 - d. describes and evaluates potential management actions that we can take to meet the expected water demand of everyone within the region during the planning period
 - e. sets specific targets to be accomplished by specified future dates within the planning period
 - f. identifies costs and potential sources of money to pay to implement the plan
 - g. sets priorities for implementation
 - h. describes a process to amend the plan
 - i. satisfies the guidelines published by DWR for IRWM plans
 - j. satisfies the requirements published by DWR for AB 3030 groundwater management plans
 - k. qualifies entities within our region to apply for water related grant funds from State sources such as Prop. 50, Prop. 1E, and Prop. 84
 - l. Describes implementation framework and administration of grant funds

2. Discuss and describe how all current broad-based regional planning efforts are related and how they will be coordinated.
 - a. IRWMP
 - b. Adjudication
 - c. Water Storage District Proposal
 - d. Water Banking JPA
 - e. Watershed Planning
 - f. Antelope Valley Water Conservation Coalition

3. Develop and implement an outreach strategy for the preparation of the plan by February 15, 2007 informing the target audiences of the following:
 - a. the need for regional planning
 - b. benefits of a cooperative approach
 - c. the priorities for implementation
 - d. how the public can participate
