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Antelope Valley IRWM Plan Goals

- Improve regional competitiveness for future state and federal grant funding.
 - Under Prop 50 Chapter 8 Round 2, there is \$215 million that will become available in 2007.
 - The Caves initiative (Prop 84), which will be on the November '06 ballot, will earmark \$1 billion for IRWM projects.

Antelope Valley IRWM Plan Goals (cont.)

- Develop a comprehensive plan to meet the Antelope Valley's future water supply and reliability by evaluating opportunities for:
 - Water banking and conjunctive use
 - Water recycling
 - Water conservation
 - Water quality protection and improvement
 - > Storm water capture and management
 - > Flood management
 - Groundwater management
 - > Recreation and public access
 - > Environmental and habitat protection and improvement

Antelope Valley IRWM Plan Goals (cont.)

Foster coordination, collaboration, and communication among Antelope Valley water agencies and interested stakeholders to reach consensus on IRWMP projects.

Overview of Draft MOU

- Purpose of the MOU
 - To establish the Regional Water Management Group in accordance with Water Code Section 10537.
 - > To provide cost-sharing arrangement.
- Basis for preparation of the draft MOU
 - Modeled after the MOU for 2005 UWMP.
 - Samples prepared for the North Coast IRWMP and the Greater Los Angeles County Region IWMP.

Content of the Draft MOU

- Each Agency agrees:
 - ➤To provide and share all necessary and relevant information, data, studies, and/or documentation.
 - To review and comment on the draft and final versions of the technical reports and the IRWMP.
 - ➤ To present the IRWMP to its governing body for consideration and adoption.
 - To provide a financial contribution towards the IRWMP development.
 - ➤ To prepare, review, and approve future grant applications.

Recommended Cost-Sharing Criteria

■ <u>Tier No. 1 Level of Contribution — \$60,000</u>

> Public water agencies serving a population of 100,000 or more

■ Tier No. 2 Level of Contribution — \$45,000

- Public water agencies serving a population between 20,001 and 99,999
- > Public wastewater agencies
- Incorporated cities

■ Tier No. 3 Level of Contribution — \$5,000

- > Public water agencies serving a population of 20,000 or less
- > Non-public agencies
