



## Step-by-Step Guide

## **COVID-19 Temporary Outdoor Dining Program Temporary Parklet Permit**


The following are step-by-step instructions for restaurant owners applying for a Temporary Parklet Permit.

- 1. Before beginning the application, read the <u>Temporary Parklet Guidelines</u> for eligibility criteria, applicant requirements, and application and review processes.
- 2. Applicants must submit an online application to Public Works through the County's Electronic Permitting and Inspections portal, <u>EPIC-LA</u>.
- 3. Once on the Epic-LA website, click Login or Register.






4. Register for a new account by clicking Register Here or log into an existing account.




5. After logging in, click Apply.






6. On the Application Assistant page, type "COVID-19 Temporary Outdoor Dining – Parklet" in the search box and click search. The permit application will appear. Click **Apply** to continue to the application.




7. Follow the on-screen prompts to input the required information.





The last prompt on the application will be to upload the required documents before you can submit your application.



## Required Documents:

- 1. Description of the temporary parklet dining furnishings and equipment (e.g., tables, chairs, etc.).
- 2. Dimensioned site plan depicting the location of the proposed outdoor parklet along with all pertinent existing roadway features including, without limitation, the following:
  - a. Sidewalk
  - b. Parking stalls
  - c. Adjacent bicycle lane or vehicular travel lane
  - d. Location of existing utility pullboxes in the sidewalk and in the street
  - e. Location of catch basins/drains
  - f. Existing stopping/parking restrictions
  - g. Nearby Driveways
  - h. Permanent above-ground street fixtures such as utility poles, streetlights, parking meters, electrical boxes, fire hydrants, and newspaper stands



The site plan should also depict the proposed layout of the outdoor parklet dining furnishings and equipment and location of the required ADA compliant, non-slip ramp (if parklet is proposed on the road pavement) or elevated platform (to extend the sidewalk).

- 3. Evidence of Commercial General Liability Insurance with a minimum of \$1,000,000 per occurrence limit, naming the County of Los Angeles as an additional insured.
- 4. A copy of the restaurant's valid health permit.
- 5. Detailed traffic design plans signed and stamped by a licensed professional engineer in the State of California, showing the location of any proposed traffic safety barriers signing, and/or striping. (Option 2 only)
