BOARD MOTION OF OCTOBER 29, 2019, AGENDA ITEM 62-C ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE FOR COMMUNITY NEAR EASTERN HILL LANDFILLS WEEKLY REPORT

This is the weekly progress report in response to the Board's motion of October 29, 2019. Agenda Item 62-C, which directed Public Works in coordination with the Chief Executive Office and County Counsel to:

- Expedite implementation of any mitigation required by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD);
- Explore implementation of other mitigation above requirements by SCAQMD:
- Schedule a series of community meetings with relevant State and local agencies that are conducted in a culturally competent and linguistically sensitive manner to provide regular updates to the community members living, working, or attending school in the area surrounding Eastern Hill Landfills; and
- 0 Report back weekly on the above directives until implementation is complete.

Mitigation Required by SCAQMD

Project plans for the landfill gas (LFG) extraction system were approved for construction. The Board letter seeking approval to advertise the project for construction bids will come before the Board today, February 4, 2020. Upon Board approval, Public Works will release the adopted plans and specifications for bids to be received no later than March 31; 2020.

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Additional Mitigation

Landscape enhancements, traffic improvements, and road repair were identified as items that would benefit the project. Public Works continues to evaluate the road conditions and identify the scope of the road repairs for the nearby Sheriff Road and to develop a landscape plan for the immediate area next to the LFG extraction system.

A work plan to address fissure conditions at the site until the landfill gas extraction system is installed was approved by the Local Enforcement Agency on December 18, 2019. In addition, the Agency requested a Postclosure Maintenance Plan be submitted by February 18, 2020, identifying permanent measures that will be taken to prevent landfill gas emissions and maintenance of the repairs at the site, including Sheriff Road. Considering the time to develop a thorough Postclosure Maintenance Plan and the time to conduct review of the final plan, Public Works is requesting an extension from the Local Enforcement Agency to March 30, 2020. A Notice to Proceed has been issued to the consultant team to perform the fissure repair work. The community was informed of the fissure repair work plan at the January 28, 2020, public meeting, and the repair work started the following day.

Coordination with Public Health to Assess Human Health Risks

The Board's motion of October 29, 2019, directed Public Health in coordination with Public Works, Chief Executive Office, and County Counsel to:

- Review data to determine potential human health risks to residents living in the community surrounding Eastern Hill Landfills;
- Conduct outreach and provide any necessary services through Public Health Nurses and promotores;
- Identify internal or external sources of funding for this work; and
- Report back in 90 days regarding the above directives.

On November 18, 2019, Public Health requested that Public Works develop a work plan to:

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- Review available data and provide a work plan to address the collection of 0 additional data, including, but not limited to, expanded chemical testing of surface and subsurface vapors and routine environmental monitoring in the community surrounding the Cogen Landfill; and
- Conduct a comprehensive health risk assessment of community members living, ۲ working, or going to school near the Cogen Landfill.

The draft work plan will be completed by January 30, 2020. The final work plan will be submitted to Public Health in February for review and approval. Progress meetings between Public Works, Chief Executive Office, and Public Health are being conducted in the interim to complete the work plan.

Community Engagement

Community meetings continue to be a key component of the public outreach effort and include the recent meeting noted below.

On January 28, 2020, the First Supervisorial District, Public Works, Public Health, 0 and the Chief Executive Office conducted a community update meeting at City Terrace Park to discuss the upcoming fissure repair work; the February 4, 2020, Board letter recommendations; the status of the comprehensive health risk assessment; and Public Health's creation of an area newsletter to further inform the community of the project as well as other items occurring in the community. Notice of this event was hand delivered to residences within 1,000 feet of the project site, posted on the dedicated project website, and e-mailed to residents who provided their e-mail addresses from past events. Language interpretation was provided at the meeting. Attendees were also informed that future community meetings would be scheduled to discuss the work plan for the comprehensive health risk assessment.

REVISED MOTION BY SUPERVISOR HILDA L. SOLIS October 29, 2019

Environmental Justice for the Community Near Cogen Landfills on Eastern Hill

Landfills have plagued the First District of Los Angeles County (County) for decades. These environmental hazards raise legitimate concerns about the health and safety of residents—and require complete and immediate mitigation and remediation. Remediation should accompany revitalization of the former landfills if safe and appropriate, such as the recreational opportunities and open space being created through the La Puente Hills Landfill Park Master Plan Project.

<u>Former Cogen and Blanchard</u> Landfills (hereinafter referred as Eastern Hill Landfills), owned in part by the County, is in unincorporated City Terrace of the First District. Although <u>Eastern HillCogen</u> Landfills <u>haves</u> been out of commission since the late 1950s, the County must take immediate and appropriate action to protect the community near <u>Eastern HillCogen</u> Landfills, where there are residents, grade school students, and a workforce essential to the County's safety net programs.

Robust community engagement is the linchpin to this work. The County must apprise residents and other individuals to ensure they are aware and help inform the

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County's remediation plan, which must be complete, transparent, and swift.

The public health and well-being of our residents is of utmost importance – and that priority extends to addressing environmental justice issues regardless of cost or convenience.

I, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors direct the Department of Public Works, in coordination with the Chief Executive Office and County Counsel, to:

- Expedite implementation of any mitigation required by the South Coast Air Quality Management District;
- Explore implementation of other mitigation above what is required by the South Coast Air Quality Management District;
- Schedule a series of community meetings with relevant state and local agencies, that are conducted in a culturally-competent and linguistically-sensitive manner, to provide regular updates to the community members living, working, or attending school in the area surrounding <u>Eastern HillCogen</u> Landfills; and

4. Report back weekly on the above directives until implementation is complete.

I, FURTHER, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors direct the Department of Public Health, in coordination with the Department of Public Works, Chief Executive Office, and County Counsel, to:

- Review data to determine potential human health risks to residents living in the community surrounding <u>Eastern HillCogen</u> Landfills;
- Conduct outreach and provide any necessary services through Public Health Nurses and promotores;

3. Identify internal or external sources of funding for this work;

4. Report back in 90 days regarding the above directives.

I, FURTHER, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors direct County Counsel to evaluate legal and administrative options against the other current owners of the <u>Eastern HillCogen</u> Landfills, and the former owners and operators of the <u>Eastern</u> <u>HillCogen</u> Landfills.

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
