Harbor-UCLA Replacement Program







Harbor-UCLA Medical Center

- Harbor-UCLA is a 373-bed safety net, teaching hospital, owned and operated by Los Angeles County Department of Health Services.
- Serves over 3 million people in a service area that covers southwestern Los Angeles County.
- Originally built in the 1940's as a military hospital.
- Current hospital opened in 1963.
- Level I Trauma Center that provides over 90,000 Emergency Department visits annually.
- Operates a full complement of primary and specialty care outpatient clinics that provide over 300,000 visits annually.
- An economic driver that employs over 4,300 people. Affiliated with the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA and trains over 500 physician residents each year.
- Campus includes The Lundquist Institute, the hospital's research partner since the 1950s.



Program Objectives

- Construct 6 new buildings to provide patients with modern cutting-edge facilities in which to receive their health care.
- Expand the capabilities of the campus to reach the growing community health care needs.
- Integrate the new facilities with the existing campus to optimize the provision of care.
- Comply with State mandated minimum earthquake safety requirements.
- Optimize operational effectiveness and reduce operational and maintenance costs.
- Improve the integration of outpatient clinic services.
- Create a campus designed for the well-being of patients, staff, and the surrounding neighborhood.

- All new buildings will be designed and constructed to minimize impacts to the
 environment including reduced energy demands, use of locally sourced materials
 and recycling of construction waste.
- Complete program to serve the community during the 2028 Summer Olympics.
- The new facilities will include:
 - A 9-story, 347-beds Hospital.
 - A 6-story Clinic Building that will consolidate existing outpatient clinics into a single location.
 - A 1,500-space parking structure.
 - A new Laboratory Building, and two additional support buildings.



Hospital Building

- In February 2024, the Replacement Program broke ground on the new Hospital and construction is anticipated to be complete in mid-2027 and with patient care services beginning in early 2028.
- The Hospital will be a 9-story, 555,000 square-foot building with 347 patient beds, which includes 44 intensive care, over 200 medical surgical, 20 neonatal intensive care, and 36 mental health beds.
- The new Hospital will be integrated into the existing Surgery/Emergency Building.

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Clinic Building

- In June 2023, the Replacement Program broke ground on the new Clinic Building.
- Construction on the Clinic Building is expected to be complete in mid-2026 and will begin patient care by early-2027.
- The Clinic Building will be a 6-story, 374,000 square-foot facility that will
 consolidate the existing outpatient clinics into a single building.
- The first three floors will include multiple primary care medical homes, specialty care clinics, and Imaging, Rehabilitation, Outpatient Pharmacy, and Lab services.
- The top three floors will include teaching and conferencing spaces, classrooms, a large auditorium, and administrative offices.



Parking Structure

- In June 2024, the new Parking Structure opened, which added more than 1,500 new parking stalls to the Harbor-UCLA Medical Center Campus, including infrastructure to support more than 350 Electric Vehicle Stalls.
- The new Parking Structure is centrally located to ensure that patients, families, and staff will have convenient access to the new facilities on campus.
- The new Parking Structure will help to resolve parking issues on the Medical Center Campus and in the surrounding neighborhood.



Laboratory Building

- Construction of the Laboratory Building, located on the southern part of the campus, will begin in September 2024 and the building will be completed in early 2026.
- The Laboratory will be a 2-story, 29,000 square-foot building that will house a full-service testing facility that will support the Harbor-UCLA Campus.
- The first story of the new building will house a Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Substation that will serve the Harbor-UCLA Campus.



Support Services Building

- The new Support Services Building, located on the southern part of the campus, opened in June 2024.
- The 2-story, 25,000 square-foot building houses the maintenance shops, offices, and storage for the Facilities Management, Information Technology, and Safety departments.



Central Utility Plant

- The Central Utility Plant is anticipated to begin construction in October 2024 and be completed in mid-2026.
- The 1-story, 13,000 square-foot Central Utility Plant will provide utility support to the Hospital Building, Clinic Building, and the existing Surgery/Emergency Building on the Harbor-UCLA Campus.
