Upcoming Hauling at Eaton Wash Reservoir

Los Angeles County Public Works is preparing for the next phase of sediment removal at Eaton Wash Reservoir. This work is part of the County's ongoing response to the Eaton Fire and helps maintain flood protection for downstream communities.

Why This Work Continues

The Eaton Fire burned the watershed above Eaton Wash Reservoir. With less vegetation to hold soil in place, storms continue to carry sediment into the reservoir. Removing this material helps restore the space needed to capture and slow stormwater, which reduces flood risk and protects downstream communities.



VEGETATION

Trees, plants and shrubs all have roots that hold sediment (rocks, mud and soil) in place.



WILDFIRES

When wildfires occur, vegetation is burned away. There are fewer roots to hold sediment in place.



EROSION

Storms carry sediment downhill and into reservoirs and debris basins.

Project Timeline

JULY 2026: Staging and hauling preparations begin.

JULY 29 - NOVEMBER 15: Sediment hauling will take place Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Timeline subject to change.

Reducing Community Impacts

Public Works will monitor the project and use best management practices to support public safety and reduce impacts during hauling.

Measures may include dust control, trackout controls, street sweeping and other steps as needed.

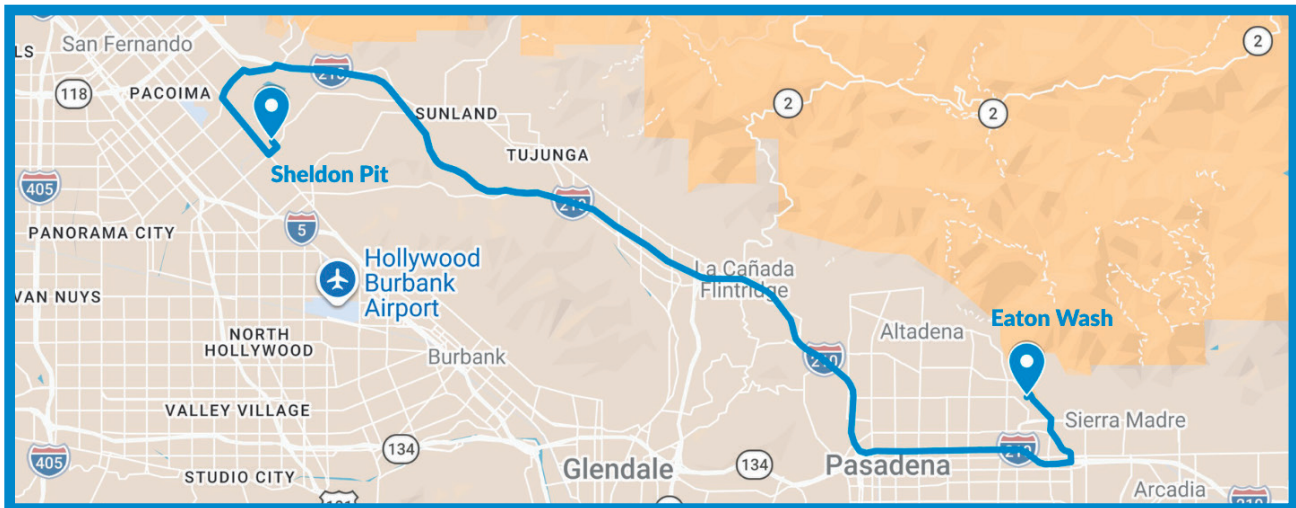

Haul Routes

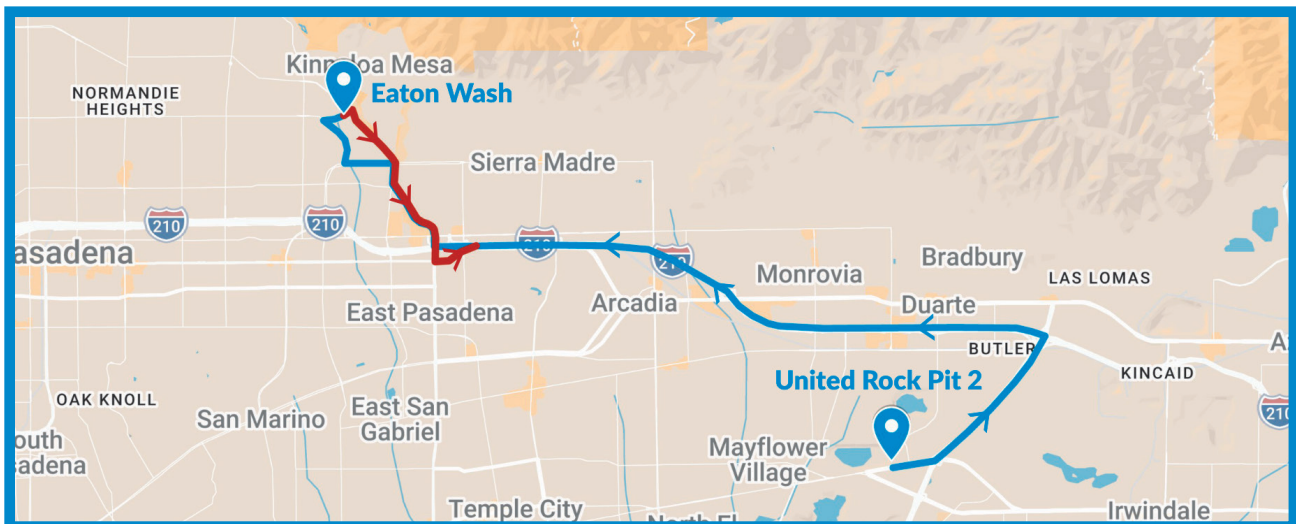
Eaton Wash to Sheldon Pit

Trucks will travel west on the 210 Freeway, west on Foothill Boulevard, south on Osborne Street, east on Glenoaks Boulevard and north on Sheldon Street.



Eaton Wash to United Rock Pit 2

Trucks will travel east on the 210 Freeway, south on the 605 Freeway and onto Arrow Highway.
