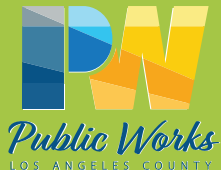

I hereby request a tree be planted in the parkway (County road right-of-way) in front of my property at no expense to me. I understand that I will be responsible for watering the tree after it is planted and the tree will not be replaced if it dies due to lack of care or vandalism.

I understand that a parkway tree will be planted based on the following conditions:

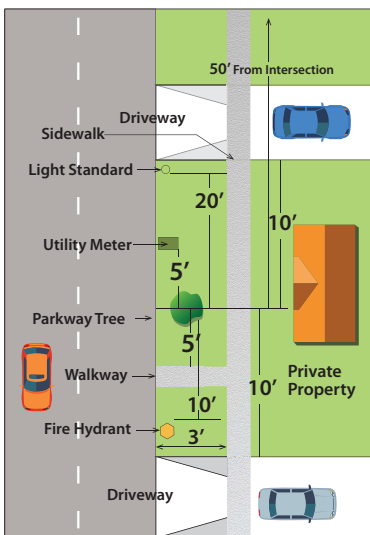
1. Spacing: Trees shall be spaced approximately fifty (50) feet apart.
2. Minimum Clearance (See diagram below):
 - a. 50 feet from the beginning of the curb radius on the approach to an intersection
 - b. 15 feet from the beginning of the curb radius on the exit side
 - c. 20 feet from light standards
 - d. 10 feet from fire hydrants and driveways
 - e. 5 feet from house walks and utility meters
 - f. 3 foot parkway width
 - g. Planting area free of utility or sprinkler lines
3. Trees will be planted based on funding availability.
