

**AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF A
PORTION OF ATLANTIC AVENUE TO ATLANTIC PLACE**

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. That the name of that portion of Atlantic Avenue lying westerly of and adjacent to Tract No. 12448 and Tract No. 10630 and between 6920 Atlantic Avenue and 72nd Street, in the City of Long Beach, County of Los Angeles, State of California, is hereby changed to, and shall hereafter be known as, Atlantic Place.

Sec. 2. The City Clerk shall transmit, without delay, certified copies of this ordinance to the Registrar of Voters, the County Clerk, the County Surveyor and the Board of Supervisors, all of the County of Los Angeles, and also to the Mayor of the City of Long Beach and to the State Board of Equalization, Sacramento, California.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE NAME OF SAN MARCO WAY FOR THAT PORTION OF THE DEDICATED PUBLIC ALLEY SOUTHWESTERLY OF, AND PARALLEL TO, APPIAN WAY, BETWEEN SAN MARCO DRIVE AND SECOND STREET, IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE NAME OF THIRTY-SECOND WAY FOR THAT PORTION OF THE DEDICATED PUBLIC STREET LOCATED NORTH OF THIRTY-SECOND STREET, EXTENDING WEST FROM SANTA FE AVENUE, IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA
