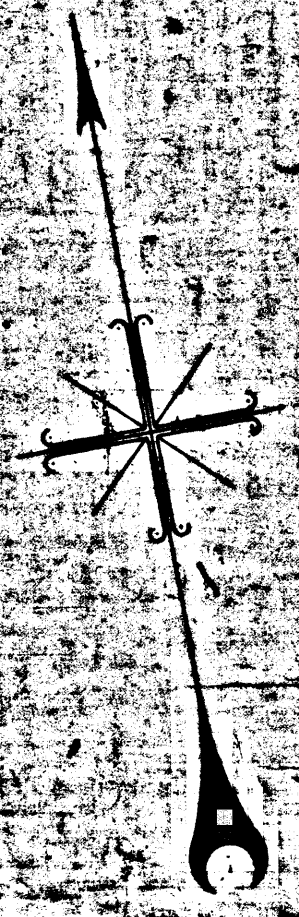

VENICE BOULEVARD AT HIGHLAND AVENUE

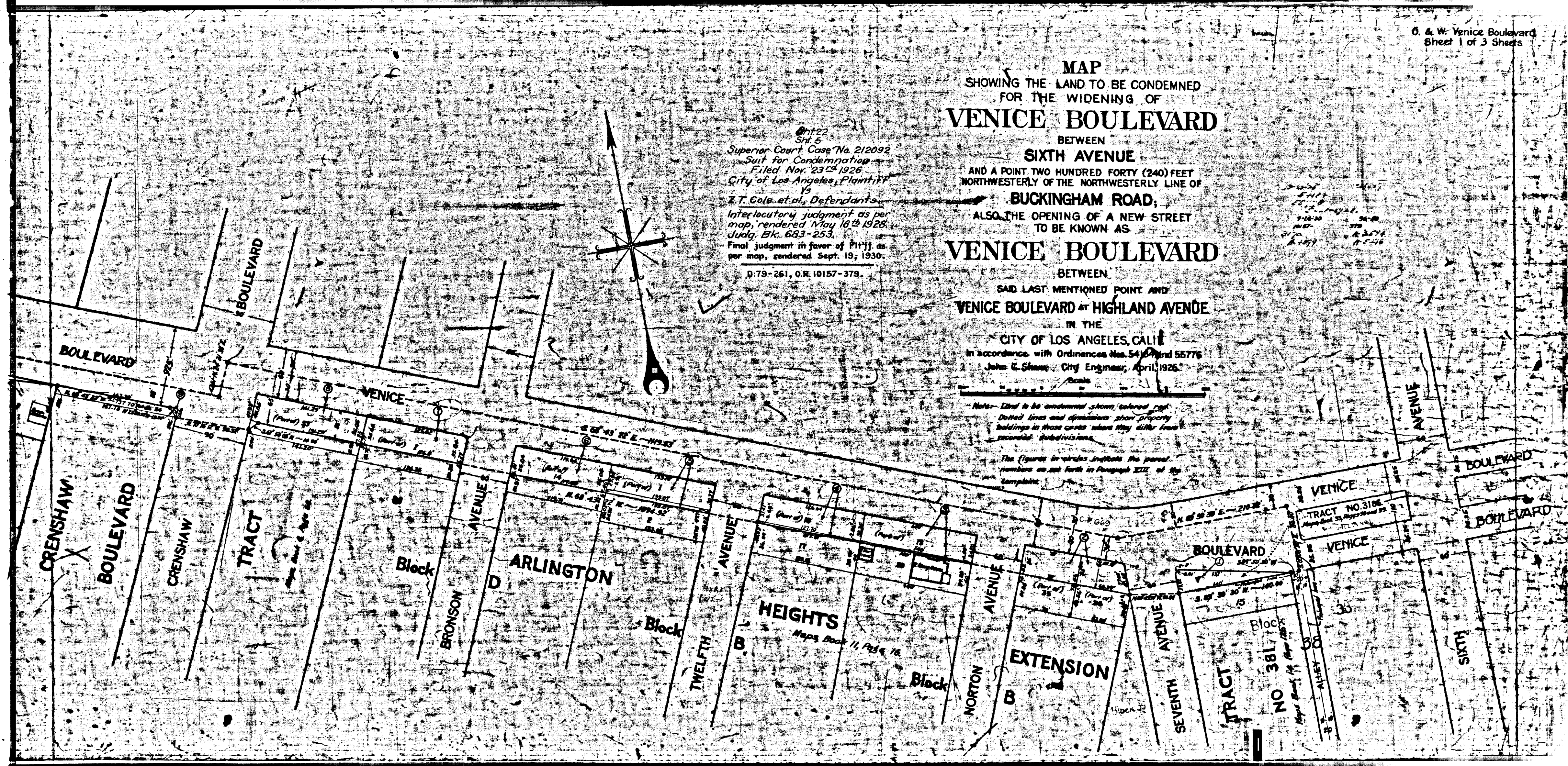
