NOTE: The County Records show that after the order declaring Citrus Avenue Extension a public highway, May 20th 1892 per R.B. 4-95 a protest was filed and the matter was referred to District Attorney Sept. 12th 1892 per R.B. 4-136.

Actions to quiet title (S.C.C. 17720 & 18279) were brought by E.T. Gordon vs. County but were dismissed upon motion of Plaintiff.

Thereafter the County commenced action (West v. Gordon vs. Gordon S.C.C. N.R. 18345) to quiet title. Judgment was given for defendant, Jan. 15 1894 in which it says: That the County has no right nor title in the lands of the Defendants on this map.

The County claims, by above declaration, title in said Citrus Ave. extension, except that portion lying within lands of Mrs. Emma Gordon as shown on this map.

NOTE: The line shown in blue is the line described in R. 5-292. No declaration was ever made along this line
