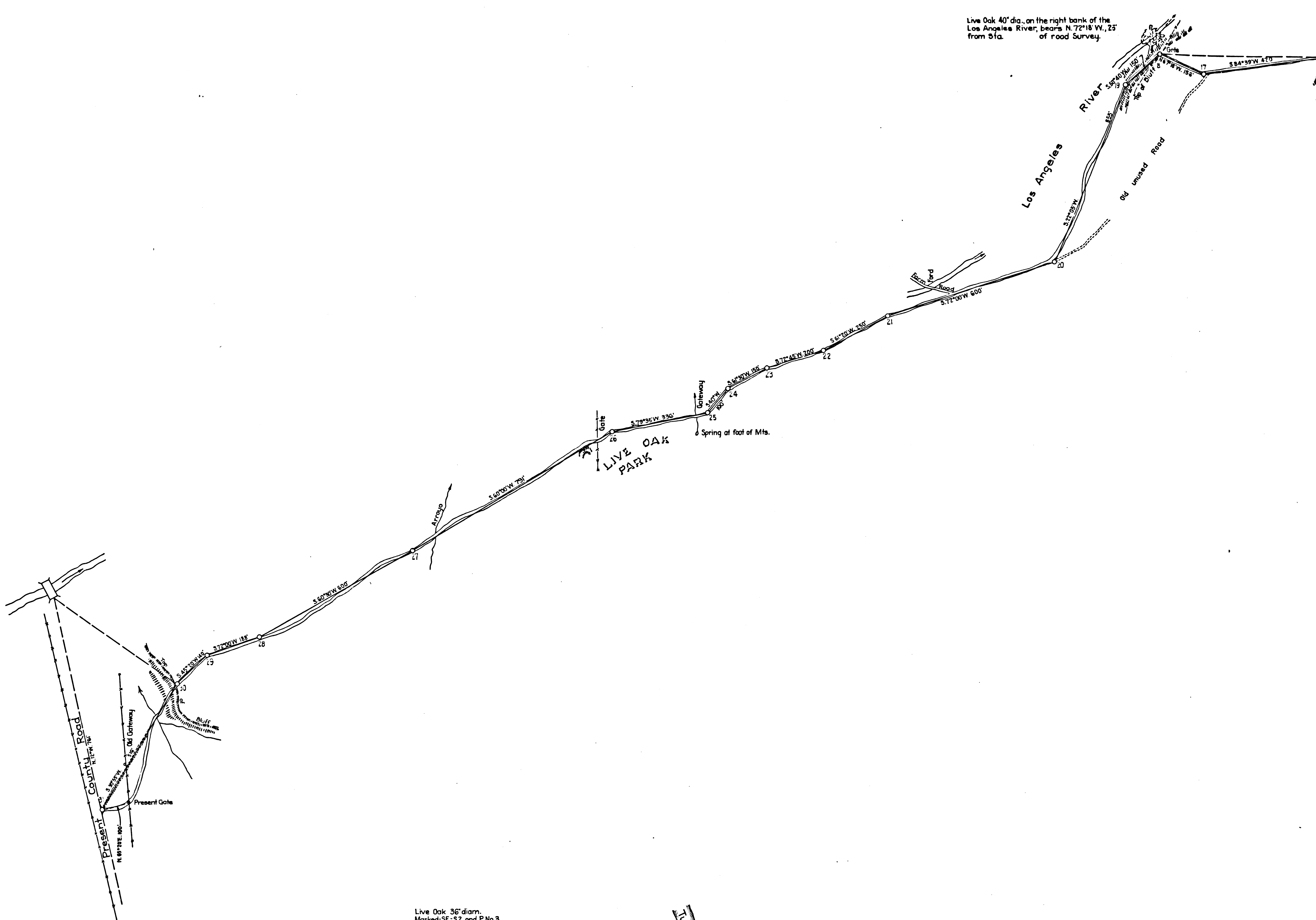
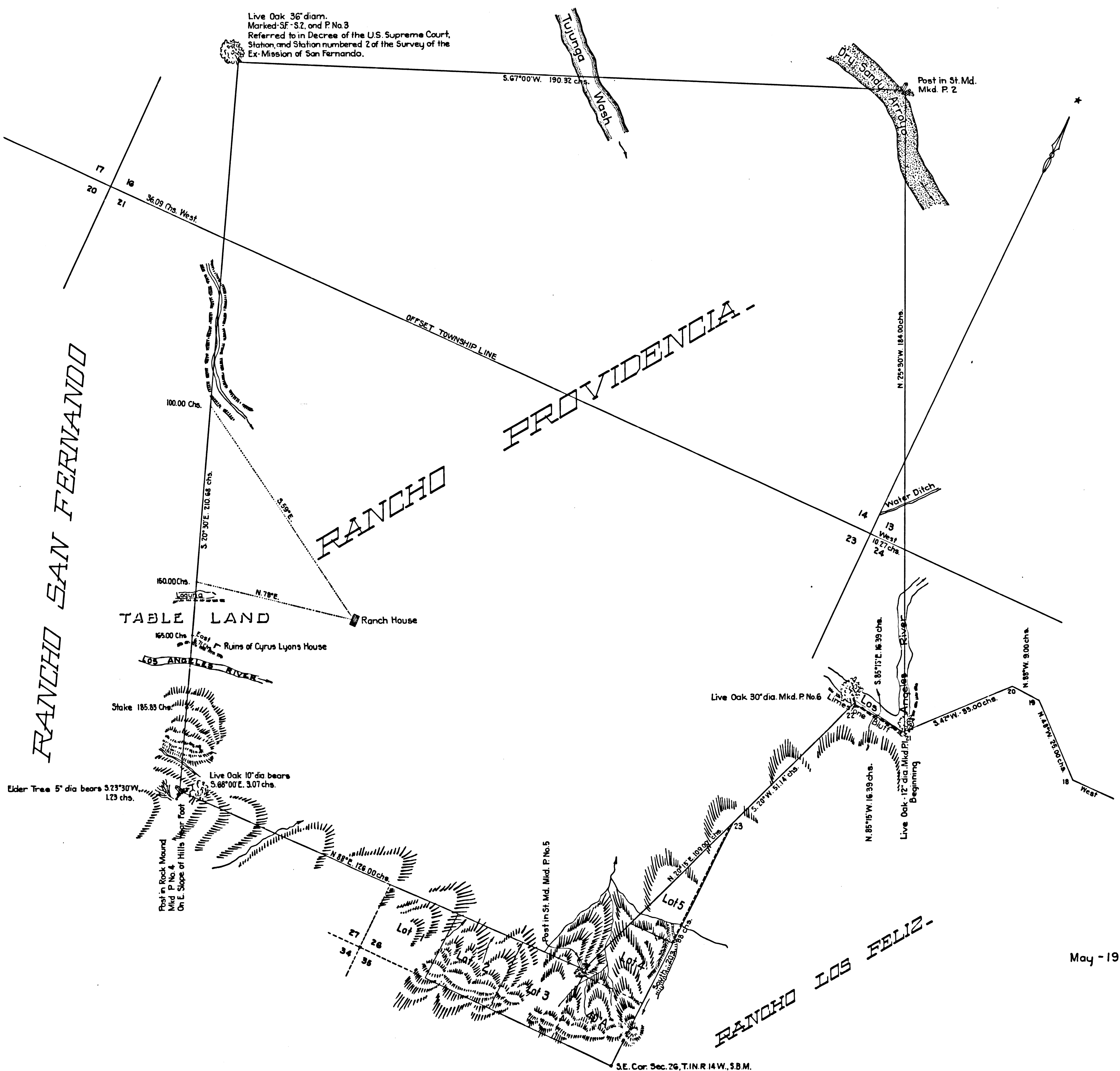


Live Oak 40' dia. on the right bank of the Los Angeles River; bears N 72° 18' W., 23' from Sta. 17
