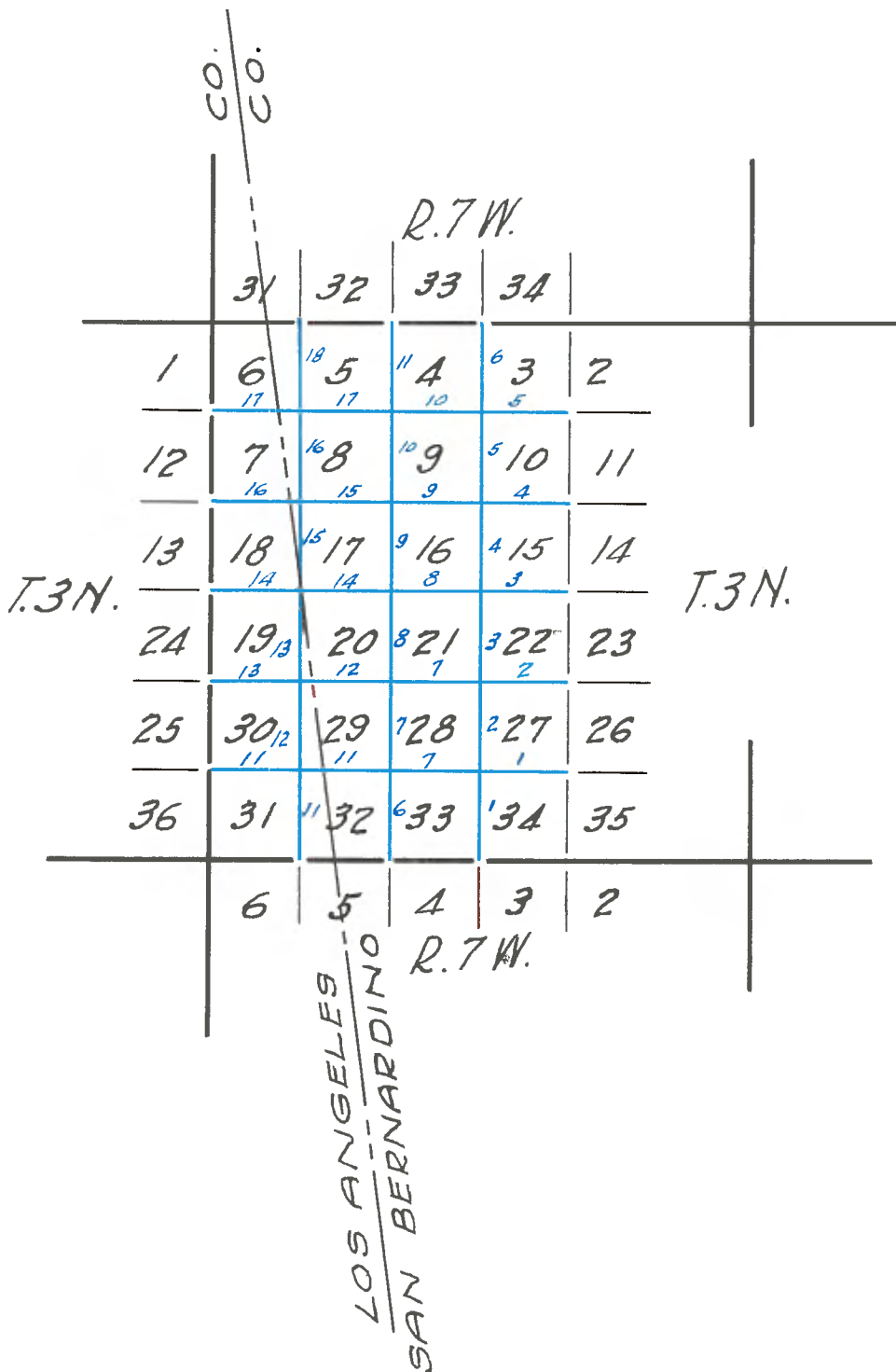

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is mostly of a mountainous character. There are some small valleys along Swarthout Canon and Lytle Creeks, with soil varying from 1st to 3rd rate.

The dividing range between San Bernardino Valley and the waters of the Pacific Ocean and Mojave Valley and waters of the "Great Sink" passes through the township, bearing the N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on Mojave side, balance of township on Pacific Ocean side.

The township is well watered by numerous streams and springs. The southern and western portions are well timbered with a fine growth of pine and fir timber.

The northern portions are well adapted to grazing being covered in most parts with a fine growth of grass, affording sustenance to large herds of cattle.

There are several settlers, Clyde Bros., in Secs. 8, 16 and 25, and one unknown in Sec. 12.

On each working day, when the sun was visible at meridian, I examined the adjustments of my solar compass, especially the solar and reversing apparatus and found them to be correct.
