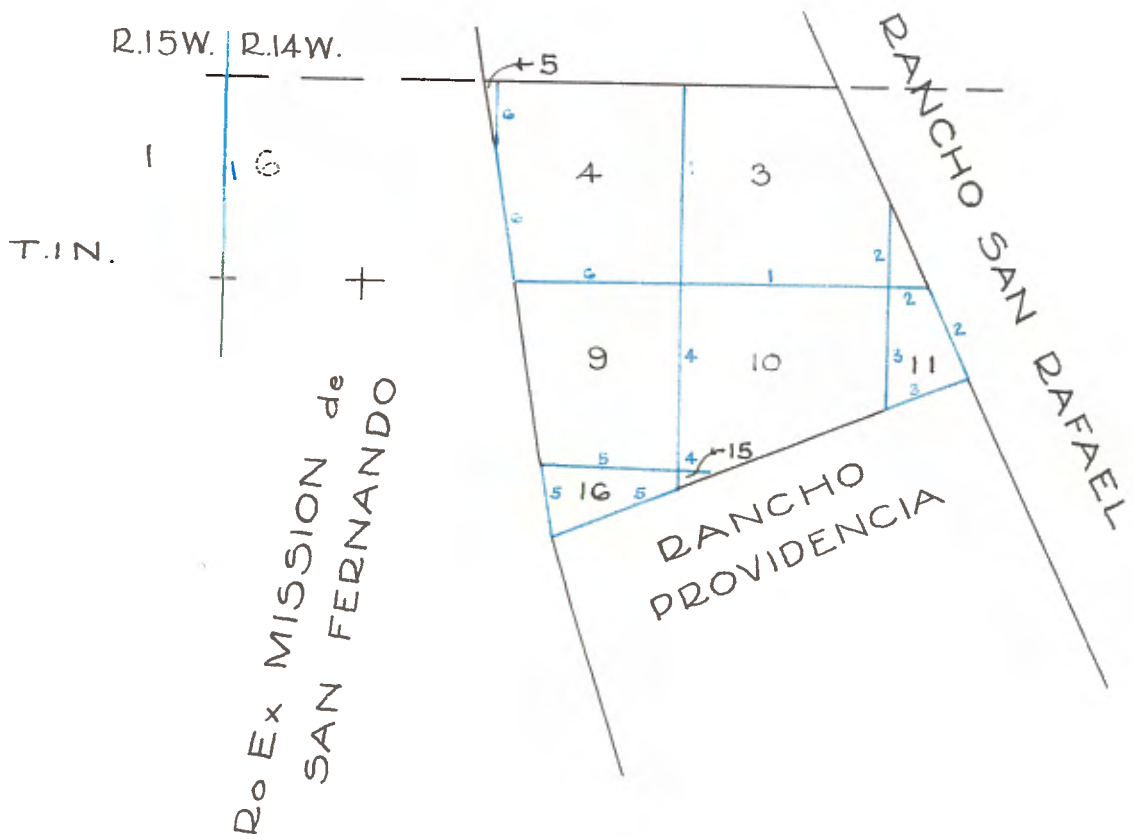


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Blue lines, run by John Goldsworthy-1876

In order to find the proper Var. for subdividing the Township, I went to the N. W. corner (the E. line of the Township not being so well defined as the W.) and run Thence south on a blank line along the west boundary of Sec. 6. Var. 14° E.

W. corner of Rancho Providencia" is visible and bears S. 67° W. I flagged this line through to the tree setting my flags so as to be able to intersect it in running south.
