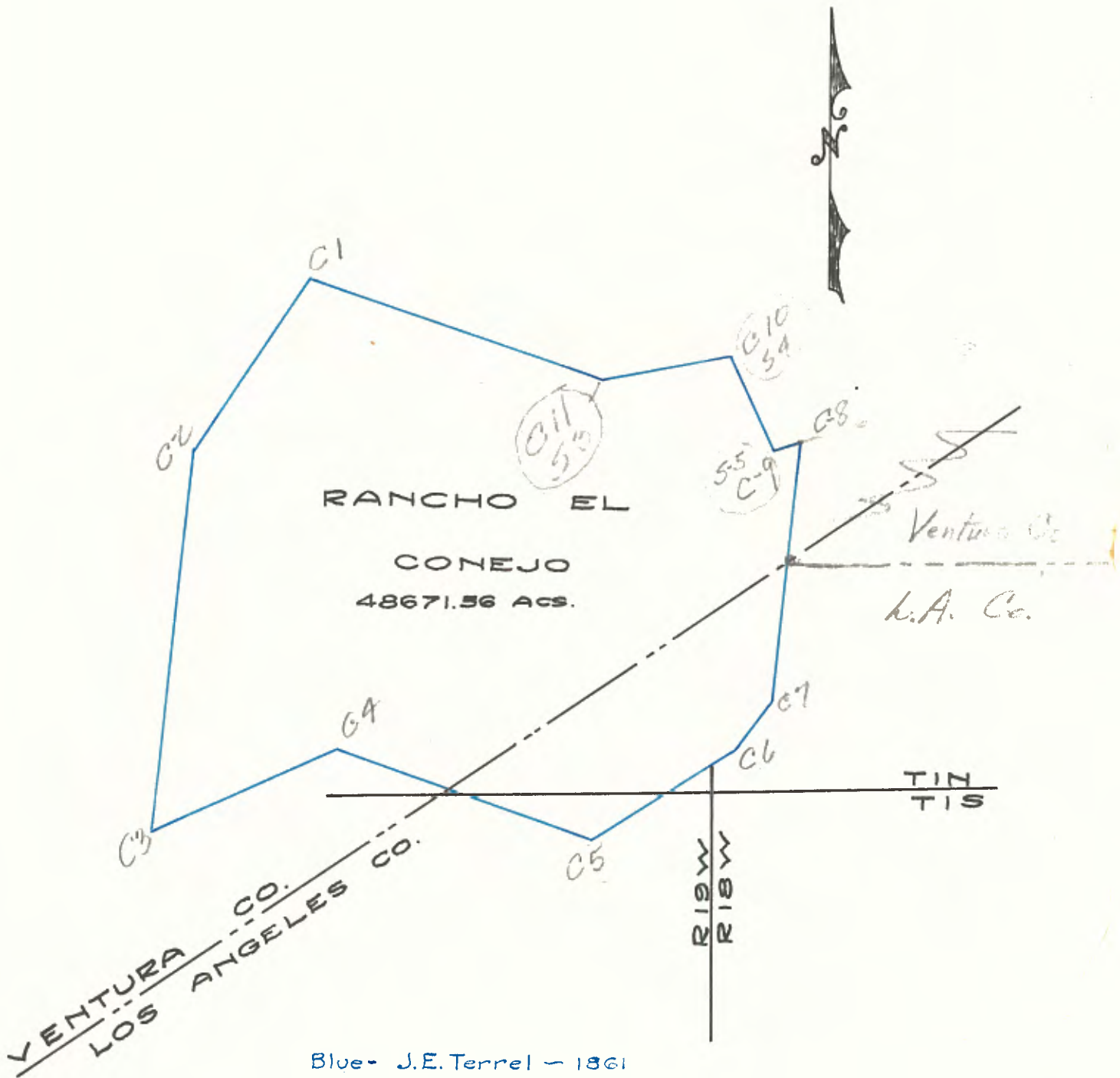


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Blue - J.E. Terrel - 1861

Fieldnotes of the final Survey of the Rancho El Conejo situated in the County of Santa Barbara and finally confirmed to Jose de la Guerra Y. Nonija.

Chains

Survey commenced January 15th 1861.

At a manzanita bush marked L. P. 3 Cor. of Rancho Las Posas; standing at the edge of precipice I, mark same C. 1 run descending.

C-1 to 2	S. 34-1/4 W.	50.00	Enter valley of Santa Rosa Creek bears nearly E. and W.
		121.00	Cross Santa Rosa Creek 50 lks. wide course N. of West.
		126.00	Leave Valley thence over rough and broken hills.
		286.00	To place called La Majonera, where there is a large mound of stone one of the old land marks, also a stake marked 26 Cor. of Rancho Guadaluasca. I mark same C. 2 and run along boundary of said Rancho, along Eastern edge of hill.
2-3	S. 6° 41' W.	20.33	Cross road through Conejo pass N. W. and S. E.
		327.83	Enter valley bears S. W. and N. E.
		362.83	Leave valley and ascend Spur.
		387.83	Top of high Spur comes from the S. E. and Descend.
		431.83	Enter Canada de los Alisos near head of same
		439.83	leave Canada bears S. W. and ascend high mountain range
		527.83	to rock mound on top of high rocky peak, a cor. of Rancho Guadaluasca, thence leaving boundary of said Rancho I run along top of Sierra del Potrero.

			to Dead Sycamore, called for in the Grant, mark same C. 7 and run
7-8	N. 7-1/2° E.	1.00	Cross road from Santa Barbara to Los Angeles bears N. E.
		75.00	mouth of Canada de Lindero hills bear N. W. and S. E. house bears S. 63° W., thence running up Canada del Lindero.
