

AFFIDAVIT OF MR. A. E. DUNN CONCERNING HIS  
INTERVIEW WITH A MR. JOE DALTON RELATIVE TO  
MONUMENTS SET BY H. J. STEVENSON ON SUBDIVIS-  
ION NO. 2 OF THE AZUSA LAND AND WATER COMPANY,  
M. R. 43-94.

To Whom It May Concern:

This is to certify that on May 6, 1932 at 2:30 P. M. I met by official appointment in my capacity as a Deputy County Surveyor, a Mr. Joe Dalton, son of Henry Dalton the original patentee of the Mexican grant known as the "Rancho Azusa Confirmed to Henry Dalton".

The purpose of my appointment with Mr. Dalton on the above date was to make inquiry relative to his connections with a surveyor by the name of H. J. Stevenson during his survey of Subdivision No. 2 of the Azusa Land and Water Company, as recorded in Book 43, Page 94, Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County.

I was informed by Mr. Dalton that he was employed by Stevenson in the capacity of chairman during a portion of the time Stevenson was engaged in making the above mentioned subdivision, and that the monuments set by him to mark the official lot corners of the subdivision consisted of iron pipes or pins set in sounds of rock.
