T.4 N., R.14 W. was originally surveyed by W. H. Norway in 1879. Resurveys executed by Los Angeles County in 1925 present a remonumentation of original corners then extant, with brass capped iron posts, 2 ins., in diameter, firmly set in concrete base. These monuments are substantial and permanent, and are adopted with only slight modification in the present resurvey.

Preliminary to resurvey all lines of the governing survey were retraced and the positions thoroughly verified. The true line results are given herein. Asimuth determination is by projection or Polaris observation recorded in T.5 N., R.14 W., maintained by successive angulation throughout the survey.

The observed magnetic declination is 1510E.

The surveys harein noted were undertaken to provide a basis for disposal of public land, under Act of June 1, 1938, 52 Stat. 609; U.S.C. 682a.

#### General Description.

This is a rolling mountainous region, the main drainage being southwesterly in Tick Canyon, from the north center of the section. Another canyon, rising near the northeast corner parallels Tick Canyon about one half mile to the East; a third courses through the extreme southeast corner. The intervening ridges rise about 500 feat to a maximum elevation of 2500 feet above sea level.

The soil is a rocky gravel of poor quality. A very scattered growth of oak and scrub cedar is found along the ridges; lesser verdure consists of greasewood, sagebrush, buckwheat and various forms of cacti.

An unimproved roadway leads up Tick Canyon, from the Soledad Highway about two miles distant. One resident, engaged in goat culture, is located in the west central portion of the section. Water has been developed here, and living quarters; and essential corral and shed facilities are noted.

There is no commercial value attaching to the land beyond the sparce browse native to the area in general. Accessibility is afforded only in Tick Canyon, and water development will be limited to the canyon floor.
