



Under and by virtue of the provisions of the 13th Section of the Act of Congress of the third of March, 1851, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California," and of the 12th Section of the Act of Congress, approved on the 31st of August, 1852, entitled "An Act making appropriations for the civil and diplomatic expenses of the Government for the year ending the 30th of June, 1853, and for other purposes," and whereas the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California, rendered a decision whereby it recognized and confirmed the title and claim of Maria Antonia Machado to the tract of land designated as Rancho Las Virgenes as appears from the certified copy of the final decree of the said District Court, a copy of which is hereto annexed, the said tract of land was surveyed in conformity to the grant thereof and the said decision, and I hereby certify that the accompanying map is a true and accurate plat of the said tract of land as appears by the field notes of the survey thereof, made in conformity with the decisions of the Commissioner of the General Land Office and Secretary of the Interior, dated respectively Sept. 12, 1877, and July 11, 1878, by William Minto, Deputy Surveyor, under the directions of this office, which field notes having been examined and approved, remain of record therein, and are in the words and figures following, to wit:
