



DIAGRAM

Exhibiting the assessment district and land to be taken for the opening of Cherry Street in the City of Pasadena, California, from the east line of the J.R. Harden Tract, as recorded in Book 6, Page 11, of Maps in the office of the County Recorder of Los Angeles County, to the west line of Los Robles Avenue, also showing the land possessed and the relative location of each district, block, lot, or portion of lot or parcel of land and its dimensions. Each block, lot or portion of lot, taken or assessed is designated and described by the number marked thereon in red ink.

Hereon the mark means feet; figures in black ink next to property lines show the length of said lines in feet; other figures in black ink show the numbers of the lots; solid black lines show original lot lines; broken black lines show subdivisions of original lots; red and violet linings show boundaries of subdivisions named; green tinting shows boundary of assessment district; orange tinting shows land to be taken for the opening of said Cherry Street.

The diagram is drawn to the scale of one hundred feet to one inch.
