OF THE

## 35 ACRE TRACTS

of the Los Angeles City Lands Hancock's Survey  
situate on the Southern slope of the  
Stone Quarry Hills.

Surveyed in August 1868 by Geo Hansen, County Surv.  
Assisted by Captain Wm Moore and August C. B. Brand.

Variation 14 1/2° East.

Scale of one inch to 16 chains.

The Streets are 50 feet wide and run N. 28° East and S. 62° W according  
to the true meridian. The lots are squares of 18.72 chains each side.

On the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September 1868 will be sold in Block A6 lots 5, 6 and 7,  
in Block A5, lots 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, in Block A2 lots, reserving roads 50 feet wide  
through the ravines marked "Salano Cemetery", "Sulphur" and "Charles' Ravine"  
to the Stone Quarries for the public use until the regular streets delineated on this  
map are improved and passable for wagons.  
The city reserves for public use lot 6 in Block A7, the fractional Blocks A1 & A3,  
also lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 8 in Block A6, lots 1, 2 and 7 in Block A2, lots 1, 2, 7 and 8  
in Block A1, and lots 1 and 7 in Block A5.

Note by County Recorder. The original map presented for record  
is on the scale of 8 chains to the inch and was reduced as above to  
accommodate the size of this Book.
