In re Vacation of Streets
 in Monte Vista Tract

A petition from the Peoples Home Savings Bank, by W.E. Palmer, Secretary, and 47 others, property holders and residents of Crescenta and Canada Road Districts, is presented and read, asking the Board, in consideration of a road 60 feet wide from the east line of the Monte Vista Tract running westerly and northerly through said Tract, being deeded to the County, to vacate certain streets in Monte Vista Tract, as designated in the petition; and upon motion of Supervisor Hanley, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that said petition be and the same is hereby granted, and it is further ordered and declared that the following named streets as shown on a map of the Monte Vista Tract, recorded in Book 6 at Page 324, Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, California, to wit: Sixth Street, Fifth Street, Fourth Street from Southwest corner Lot 106 to northwest corner Lot 87; Third Street, from southwest corner Lot 104, to northwest corner Lot 89; and from southwest corner Lot 6 to northwest corner Lot 3; Second Street from southwest corner Lot 8 to northwest corner Lot 2; North Street, from east side Fourth Street to East boundary of Tract; Hill Avenue between Fourth and Fifth Streets; Summit Avenue, between Fourth Street and East boundary of Tract; Los Angeles Street, from Fifth Street to Sixth Street; and South Street from Fourth Street to East boundary of Tract,

be and the same are hereby vacated and abandoned, and the land therein contained restored to acreage, and any offer of dedication of said streets made by the filing of said map is hereby refused, it appearing to this Board that said streets have not been used as such, and are not required for the use of the public. This order is made in consideration of a deed for a strip of land sixty (60) feet in width through said Tract, executed by the Peoples Home Savings Bank of San Francisco, California, to the County, as accepted by this Board (see page 406, this volume), to be known as Michigan Avenue, and is conditioned upon the filing for record in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County, California, of a certified copy of this order, together with a map showing all property as affected thereby and said Michigan Avenue, as deeded, and surveyed by the County Surveyor, October 5th 1898.

On account of error in apportioning the acreage between Blocks in Plat recorded in Book 72, Pages 38, 39 and 40 of Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, the acreage of Block A of said Plat should be changed to 172.39 Acres more or less and the acreage of Block B to 520.26 Acres more or less. The total acreage of Blocks A, B, C and D being 1075.11 Acres more or less.
