This being the time regularly set by order of continuance of this Board for hearing the petition of C.G. Smith et al., for the vacation and abandonment of portions of Fourth Street and Sayer Avenue in the Macloy Rancho Ex-Mission de San Fernando, the same was taken up, and John Burr appeared and was examined on behalf of the petitioners;

And upon motion of Supervisor Hanley, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that the prayer of said petition be and the same is hereby granted, no protests having been filed against granting the same.

And it is further ordered that that portion of Fourth Street lying between the north west line of Hubbard Avenue, and the East boundary line of Section 33, and that portion of Sayer Avenue lying between the south west line of Fifth Street and Section 33 which are included within the exterior boundary lines of the Macloy Rancho Ex-Mission de San Fernando, as per map thereof recorded in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County, in book 37, page 5 of Miscellaneous Records, be and the same are hereby vacated and abandoned, and the land therein contained restored to acreage, conditioned upon the filing for record, by petitioners, in the office of the County Recorder of Los Angeles County, California, of a certified of this order attached to a map showing all property as affected by the same.
