




MAP

Resolved, That the petition of John Strine et al., for the vacation of a portion of Fourth Street in the town of Downey be and the same is hereby granted, excepting a right of way ten feet wide in or near the center of said street, and it is hereby

Ordered, That all that portion of Fourth Street, from the west line of the property of M.R. Pendleton to Depot Street, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned, and the land therein contained restored to acreage, excepting therefrom a strip of land five feet wide on each side of the center line of said Fourth Street, distant 256 feet west from the west line of Depot Street, thence westerly to a point five feet north of the S.E. corner of land owned by D.D. Hill.
