

Resolution No. 105.

A resolution refusing to accept any and all offers heretofore made to dedicate to the Public a certain alley in the Bradley Tract in the City of South Pasadena.

Be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the City of South Pasadena:

That whereas, in certain deeds recorded in the Recorder's Office for Los Angeles County, California, reference is made to an alley running through the Bradley Tract from Orange Grove Avenue to Prospect Avenue and being parallel to and about two hundred and fifty feet north of Grevelia Street, which references might be considered as offers to dedicate said alley;

And whereas, such offers have never been accepted and said proposed alley is not open to the public, has never been used by the public and is not needed by the public nor by any individual;

And whereas, all persons owning property abutting on said alley have withdrawn said offers to dedicate same and have asked that said proposed alley shall forever remain closed and that all offers to dedicate same be refused:

Therefore, be it resolved that the City of South Pasadena does hereby consent to the withdrawal of all offers to dedicate said alley, does hereby refuse to accept of any of said offers, and does hereby consent that said alley shall remain forever closed.

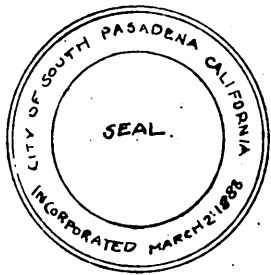
