Ordinance No. 6834.  
(New Series).

An ordinance of the Mayor and Council of the City of Los Angeles ordering that certain streets in the City of Los Angeles known and designated as Donahue Street and Francis Street, and two certain alleys, be closed up, vacated and abandoned, as contemplated by ordinance Number 6750, New Series, entitled, "An Ordinance declaring the intention of the Mayor and Council of the City of Los Angeles to close all of Donahue Street, also all of Francis Street (now known as Manola Street); also two certain Alleys, all situate in F. Biggy's Subdivision of a part of the Orange Slope Tract, in the City of Los Angeles" approved October 25th 1901.

The Mayor and Council of the City of Los Angeles do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That all those certain streets and alleys in the City of Los Angeles herein after described be and the same are hereby closed up, vacated and abandoned, to wit:

Those certain streets and alleys in the City of Los Angeles shown upon the map of F. Biggy's Subdivision of a part of the Orange Slope Tract, as per map of said Subdivision recorded in Book 29 of Miscellaneous Records of said County at pages 75 and 76 thereof, which said streets and alleys are more particularly described as follows, to wit:

All of Donahue Street as shown upon said map of said Biggy's Subdivision, said street running in a northeasterly and northwesterly direction and extending from Griffin Avenue (formerly Wood Avenue) to Henry Street; also all of Francis Street (now known as Manola Street) as shown upon said Map; said street extending from Henry Street on the west to Biggy Street on the east; also that certain alley, as shown upon said map, running from Henry Street on the west to Donahue Street on the east, and being immediately south of and adjoining lots 70 and 71 of said Biggy's Subdivision, also all that certain alley as shown upon said map running from Wood Avenue, (now known as Griffin Avenue) on the south to Hansen Street (now known as Eastlake Avenue) on the north; said alley being immediately west of and adjoining lots 10 to 22 (both inclusive) of said Biggy's Subdivision.

Section 2. That said work is for the closing up of Donahue Street and Francis Street, and those two certain alleys, aforesaid, in the City of Los Angeles, particularly described in Section 1 of this ordinance, and it appearing to the City Council of said City that there are no costs or expenses for said work, and that no assessment is necessary to pay such.
