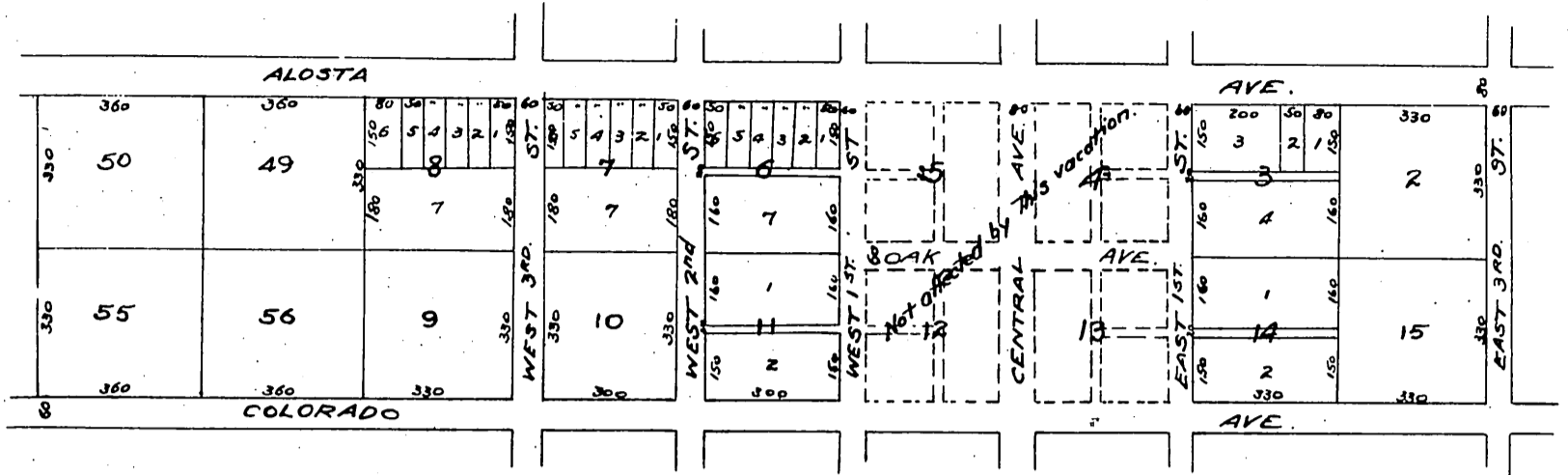


LE MARS ADDITION

The Board met in regular session pursuant to adjournment Present Supervisors E. S. Field, Chairman presiding, Geo. Alexander, James Hanley, O. W. Longden, and P. J. Wilson, and C. W. Bell, Clerk, by R. Williams deputy.

In re vacation of Streets in
Le Mars Addition to Alosta.
Petition of John F. Shank, et al.

This being the time regularly set by
order of continuance of this Board for
hearing herein, the matter is taken up

and the following protest is presented and read, to wit:-
Los Angeles, Cal. January 27, 1902.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors, Los Angeles County, California.
Gentlemen:- The Alosta Water & Development Company, a Corporation formed for the purpose of furnishing domestic water to the town of Alosta, would respectfully protest against the closing of any of the streets of the La Mars Addition, except with a provision allowing the Company to remove its pipes from said closed streets if it so desires. Alosta Water & Development Company, by Will W. Beach, Secretary.

And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the protest filed January 21st 1902 having been signed and filed under a misapprehension of facts upon motion of Supervisor Longden, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that East 2nd Street from the south line of Alosta Avenue to the north line of Colorado Avenue, also West 4th Street and West 5th Street, also Oak Avenue from west line of East 3rd Street to east line of East 1st Street, and from west line of West 1st Street to the western terminus of said Oak Avenue, except such portions as lie within West 2nd and West 3rd streets be and the same are hereby vacated and abandoned and the land therein contained restored to acreage subject to the right of the Alosta Water and Development Company to enter upon said vacated and abandoned streets to remove repair or re lay the water pipes now laid upon said vacated streets.

This order is conditioned upon the filing for record by the petitioners in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County of a certified copy hereof together with a map showing all property as affected thereby.
