This being the time regularly set by order of this Board, and publication of notice thereof, for hearing the petition of D. W. White, et al for the vacation of Fourth Street in Montebello, the matter is called up, and no protests having been filed, and no one appearing in opposition thereto, and the following consideration for said vacation being understood, to-wit:

1. That the petition for the vacation of said Fourth Street is presented by and in the interest of the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad Co. to lessen and prevent accidents at the crossing of said railroad with said street.
2. The deed executed by Kaspare Cohn and Hulda Cohn, and this day filed by said Railroad Co. is also understood to be a consideration for the abandonment of said Fourth Street
3. The following agreement, to-wit.

The Honorable Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County, California.
Gentlemen:

Should your honorable body vacate the present county road on Fourth Street, Montebello and re-open the old road along the bluff, petition for which has been duly filed with you and advertised and no protests received, which change would avoid a road crossing at grade over our tracks, we hereby agree to build and maintain a good and substantial wagon road bridge 20 feet in width over our tracks at the bluff road crossing, and construct the earth approaches there to on a grade of five per cent. We further agree, whenever so called upon by your honorable Board, to gutter and crown the re-opened portion of the bluff road covered by the petition.

Therefore in consideration of the foregoing, and upon motion of Supervisor Longden, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that Fourth Street in the subdivision known as "Montebello" as recorded in Book 78, page 19 Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, from the southerly line of McKinley Avenue to the southerly line of said subdivision, also all that portion of said Fourth Street lying immediately north of the southerly line of said Montebello and adjoining Block A of said Montebello, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned, and the land therein contained restored to acreage.

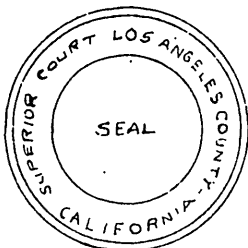
This order is further conditioned upon the petitioners filing for record in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County a certified copy hereof together with a map showing all property as affected thereby.
