Both the Santa Clarita Valley Area Plan and the Antelope Valley Areawide Plan are components of the Los Angeles County General Plan with more focused polices on these individual planning areas. The City of Santa Clarita and its four communities include Newhall, Canyon Country, Valencia, and Saugus. The Santa Clarita Valley Area Plan includes the communities of Castaic, Agua Dulce, San Francisquito Canyon, Val Verde, West Ranch, Stevenson Ranch, Westridge, Violin Canyon, Hasley Canyon, Hillcrest, and the future Newhall Ranch.
